#### I. Admission Requirements

Admission to the program is open to those applicants who possess an accredited Associate's Degree in Nursing or Diploma and RN license. Applicants must satisfy all admissions requirements as outlined on the application instructions; however, new nursing graduates may be accepted pending the results of the NCLEX examination. Applicants must provide official copies of any pre-professional nursing school and college transcripts to the Office of Online Programs (the Office of Online Programs should be contacted if an institution provides digital transcripts instead of paper versions). A transfer credit evaluation will be completed for all eligible applicants.

**The BSN online program has "rolling admissions" (i.e., ongoing) and no application deadline. Applicants may apply for the program at any time throughout the year.**
