## **DIRECTORS' NOTES**

The story of *Carrie* tends to be approached by many with various presuppositions, especially if they are familiar with Stephen King's iconic book or the cult-classic film from the 1970s.

But who is Carrie? Just as many people approach the story of *Carrie* with assumptions, the characters in the story only see Carrie through their own presumptuous lenses. As they each struggle to be seen and find their own individual identity, many fail to look around them and really see the other individuals who make up their world. Many don't see until seeing no longer makes a difference.

Set in a high school vortex of self-preservation, status is survival, and kindness seems to be a luxury not easily come by, especially for those who need it most—for the unseen. Without being truly seen, Carrie is living a life directed by the presuppositions of those who refuse to see her as a valuable part of their world...and be kind. Only when Carrie begins to live beyond what others think, will she be seen. But then...

"And now I know that once you see, you can't unsee." -Sue Snell, Act 2, Scene 7 Whatever assumptions you do or do not bring to this show, may your sight be broadened.

When thinking about *Carrie*, my mind conjures an image of an exposed rock wall. The wall reveals strata, created by opposition and compression. Like my mental landscape, *Carrie* is a layered story of power struggles. At the core is the age-old theme of surviving adolescence and finding one's position in the social hierarchy of high school. Within this context, each character must decide how to treat Carrie and the potential relinquishment of status based upon their decision. While Chris and Carrie do not share similar lives at school, both young women find themselves locked in conflict with parental expectations at home. Carrie's mother, Margaret, vacillates between loving and fanatically protecting her only child from adulthood. While Carrie struggles to understand her mercurial mother, her life is complicated by the awakening of extraordinary abilities.
