Description: The successful candidate will join a multidisciplinary team of faculty to: teach and mentor graduate and undergraduate students; participate and share in the leadership decisions affecting curriculum development, scholarship, outreach, public service, and serve as liaison to the scientific/practitioner community for the Master of Science in Emergency Management program and the Center for Disaster Research and Education (CDRE). The Center provides multi-disciplinary education, research, and internship opportunities, and plays an active role in the education and workforce development of the next generation of emergency managers. CDRE is involved in conducting and disseminating research, and contributes to communities within the region and nation. The Master of Science in Emergency Management (MSEM) and the undergraduate minor in Environmental Hazards and Emergency Management (EHM) are offered through CDRE and within the School of Science and Mathematics. The MSEM program courses are taught by a team of multidisciplinary faculty that include but are not limited to experts in emergency management, scientific applications, and disaster studies among others. The program is designed to enhance students' skills in leading efforts in planning, mitigation and response. Required: 1) Earned Ph.D. or equivalent from an accredited college or university by the time of the appointment, 2) experience in emergency management or a closely related field; 3) ability to develop and teach core courses in the online interdisciplinary master's degree program such as Principles and Practices of Emergency Management, and undergraduate courses for the on-campus minor in Environmental Hazards and Emergency Management; 4) ability to incorporate practical and applied experiences into the graduate courses; 5) ability to pursue a scholarly agenda and to serve as research mentor to graduate and undergraduate students; 6) demonstrate effective oral and written communication skills; 7) ability to teach students from diverse populations and cultures. 8) Completion of a successful interview that includes a presentation which serves as a teaching demonstration.

Preferred: Knowledge of public policy, continuity of operations, risk management, and public administration. Experience in program development, building partnerships and collaboration with community partners.
