Ebola, Social Media and Cybersecurity

The CDRE has been well represented in various emergency management activates across the region in early October 2015.

October is National Cybersecurity Month, and the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission held a meeting in Harrisburg between governmental, private and academic entities on Thursday, October 1st. Dr. Hagelgans, assistant professor at the CDRE addressed the room with information on the importance of cybersecurity. The CDRE represented the academic and emergency management communities as the PUC released its cybersecurity best practices, outlining methods to best secure identity and property from theft.

On Friday, October 2nd, the CDRE was well represented as several students and instructors attended a conference at the Hershey Lodge where keynote speaker Dr. Ian Crozier discussed lessons learned from the recent Ebola crisis. Dr. Crozier is an internationally known Ebola survivor, and he spoke of his near brush with death and passed along

personal experiences and lessons from his case. Scott Mickalonis, emergency preparedness program manager at Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center and MSEM graduate was a speaker at the conference and an integral part of the planning committee.

On Tuesday, October 6th a group of instructors and students from the CDRE attended a social media conference at the Cumberland County Department of Public Safety in Carlisle. Dr. Hagelgans coordinated the program and registration. The course titled "Social Media for Disaster Response and Recovery" is part of a series which is designed to engage emergency planners in social media, exploring trends and opportunities for disaster management in an ever expanding medium.
