NEW UNDERGRADUATE CURRICULUM

1. AEST: Integrative STEM Education minor.

NEW UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

- 1. ERCH 190: Introduction to Integrative STEM Pedagogy. 3 credits. This course will serve as an introduction to students enrolled in the Integrative STEM Education minor. Students will learn basic information regarding integrative STEM education and examine various curricular models.

Students will demonstrate and apply knowledge, skills, and dispositions related to the implementation of integrative STEM education at the pre-K to grade 4 level.
- 6. ERCH 495: Integrative STEM Education Practicum. 3 credits. Course to provide opportunities for teacher candidates to bridge theory and practice.
