Information	Academic Summer Institute	
Course	Session A: OSEH 120: Safety, Health, and Environmental Issues (3 credits) Occupational Safety and Environmental Health 120: Introduction to safety, health, and environmental issues that impact people and workplaces. Includes the historical development of safety, the impact of accidents on society, a legislative overview and basic principles of personal risk assessment and management. This course is recommended for students majoring in business, engineering, and the sciences. Session B: ERCH 190: Introduction to Integrative STEM Pedagogy (3 credits) Early Childhood 190: Serves as an introduction to Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM) education methods. Students will learn about integrative STEM education and examine various curricular models.

SUMMER INSTITUTES

Culture and Language Summer Institute

Participate on a cultural immersion and English language-focused program. Participants visit local sites and regional excursions. This program is not credit-bearing but includes 50-75 teaching hours for the learning components. Students receive a Certificate of Completion.

Academic Summer Institute

Take an academic class during one or two summer sessions. Participants visit local sites and regional excursions. This program is credit-bearing and students may expect to receive 3 or 4 credits per session. Students will receive an official Millersville University transcript.

HOUSING

Participants in any summer institute are guaranteed oncampus housing in MU's residence hall.

Students reside in The Villages. It is within walking distance of the main dining hall and the Student Memorial Center, which houses the gym, several eateries, school store, club offices, computer lab, and study space.

The Villages each have a shared full kitchen. The shared kitchen allows for student to cook homemade meals with their roommates or other friends. There are lounges in the building for students to enjoy. Shared laundry facilities are also available.

Double Suite:

A double room has two beds, two desks, two dressers, and closets. Two double rooms share two bathrooms. This is the default housing option.

Note: A single room may be available for an additional fee.











DINING

The main dining hall is located near on-campus housing and is called the Upper Deck. It has numerous food stations and can accommodate a vegetarian and gluten-free dietary needs. Special dietary requirements can be accommodated upon request.

The dining hall has a grill area, stir-fry or pasta areas, soups, oven baked pizza, egg and omelet bar, self-serve waffle bar, fresh salad bar, deli, and dessert choices.
