Meet the Communications/Public Relations Coordinator

What is your name and title?

Thomas P. Boyle, Ph.D., APR Professor of Communication

How long have you been at MU and in what positions?

I began as an assistant professor of communication in 2001, became an associate professor in 2006 and a professor in 2014. I have served in various leadership roles at M.U. I was department chair 2006-2014 and director of the Entrepreneurial Leadership Center 2014-2017.

Can you tell us about your family?

I have a lovely grown daughter who is in a mental health counselor in Pittsburgh. I also have two cats, Reese and Coco, who live with me in Hershey, PA.

What do you enjoy doing outside of

work?

I truly love teaching our students and all that comes with being a public relations educator. I have had the opportunity to teach and/or mentor more than 5,000 students in my career, here at M.U. and earlier at Susquehanna University.

What do you like about working with the Online business students?

While some skills remain the same, like the ability to tell a news story, the vehicles to do so change. I feel blessed to work with students whose work habits and connections with our mediated reality change. I am encouraged to work with such gifted and diverse students.

Do you have any advice for our online students?

Become engaged with your profession!

While coursework provides the skills and theoretical foundation to work in the public relations or a related professions, your education at M.U. is shaped by your investment of time in other activities, like our campus' chapter of the Public Relations Student Society of America.

There are many opportunities to get involved online or in-person with PRSSA-MU. Also, do an internship for university credit or – even better – do more than one! Internships can be completed in several ways – online, hybrid or in-person. Along with senior-level seminars and major coursework, internships and PRSSA are other opportunities to take the skills and theories you have learned and apply them. The work produced can really give you an advantage in your personal, academic and professional careers.

Top Challenges Online Students Face - Lack of Motivation

When you first started your online program, you were probably extremely excited about this new adventure in your life. You were fully engaged and committed to your goal.

However, as time passed and you found yourself sitting in front of a computer screen for hours, you may have started to lose motivation.

Attending classes and completing assignments online requires a lot of discipline.

How to Cope

How can you maintain student motivation and engagement throughout your coursework? Try these ideas:

Get feedback: Make sure you get timely feedback from professors and other students on a regular basis. This will keep you motivated and also help you track your progress in the course. You could also set up a study group online. Set goals: Write down your daily goals and to-do lists and work through these to get things done and meet deadlines. Crossing things off your list comes with a feeling of accomplishment, which helps sustain motivation.

Stay on track: Be sure to keep up with your classes, assignments, and projects, and don't fall behind. Deal with problems with motivation as soon as they show up.

New OP Program: Fully-Online Undergradute Business Degree

The Office of Online Programs is excited to announce our first fully-online undergraduate degree program in Business Administration, Marketing and Management.

Starting in Fall 2024, online students will be able to start the business undergraduate program without previous credits at MU or transfer credits.

Changes to Registration Holds

Changes have been made to how holds are assessed to accounts. Holds are maintained on accounts with a past-due balance.

If your account has a past-due balance of less than \$2,000, a transcript hold will be maintained on your account until the balance is paid in full. However, access to registration will not be restricted.

If your account has a past-due balance of \$2,000 or more, you will not be able to proceed with registration until the balance is brought below \$2,000. Transcripts will be withheld until the balance is paid off in full.

Thus, when you receive an email from one of the Online Support Specialists that we are unable to register you due to a Hold on your account, your past due balance is over \$2,000. You will need to contact the Office of Student Accounts at osa@millersville.edu or 717.871.5101 in order to resolve the issue.
