

TIMELY WARNING

OFF-CAMPUS INCIDENT ALERT

Sexual Assault

This communication is prepared as part of the Timely Warning requirement of the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act of 1990. This federal law requires a general communication to the campus community of all crimes reported to campus or local police departments that may pose a threat to the campus community. Such reports shall be provided to students and employees in a manner that is timely and that may aid in the prevention of similar occurrences.

Millersville University Police were notified this afternoon by a student that a sexual assault took place at an off campus party within two blocks of campus in the early morning hours between approximately 1:00 – 2:00 am, May 4, 2014. The location of the assault is NOT on University owned property or on campus but a timely warning is issued to alert students of the crime and exercising caution. The location of the assault is not being listed at this time to protect the investigation and the reporting student's identity.

A female student reported that she was at an off campus party for a couple of hours and left without incident to return to campus. The student reported that as she returned, she realized she left an item at the party and she returned to retrieve the item. The student reported that when she returned, she was raped by an unknown white male. The student returned to campus and was assisted by peers and reported the incident to University Police. The incident occurred off campus, and Millersville Borough Police responded and are investigating the sexual assault.

Anyone who may have knowledge or information about this assault is urged to contact Sgt. Jason Scott of the Millersville Borough Police Department at 717-872-4657 or Millersville University Police at 717-872-3433. Callers may remain anonymous.

Members of the campus community are urged to take personal safety precautions including keeping all outside lights on, walking with other known students and reporting all suspicious persons and activity to police. The Millersville University Police Department provides a safety escort from 11 p.m. – 7 a.m. available by calling 872-3433.
