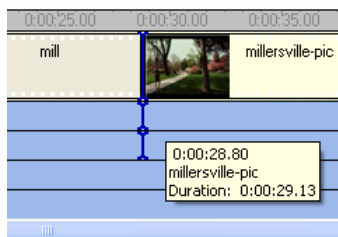
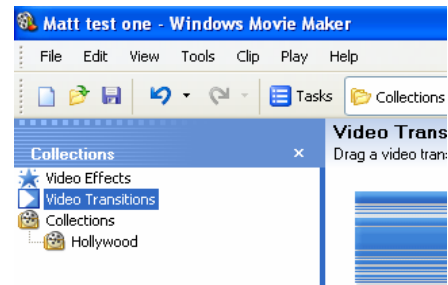


Adding Video Transitions into Windows Movie Maker 6 Steps

This Step-by-Step explains the procedures for adding video transitions into a Windows Movie Maker file.

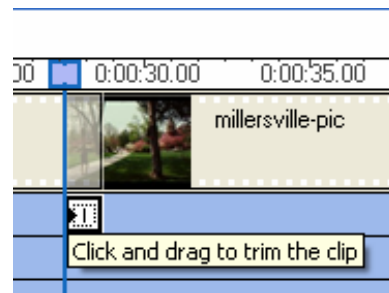
Prerequisite: This Step-by-Step assumes that a new Movie Maker has been created, has been opened, and images have been added to the movie.

- 1) After you have placed all of your images into the movie, you can add transitions. Click Video Transitions on the left hand side.



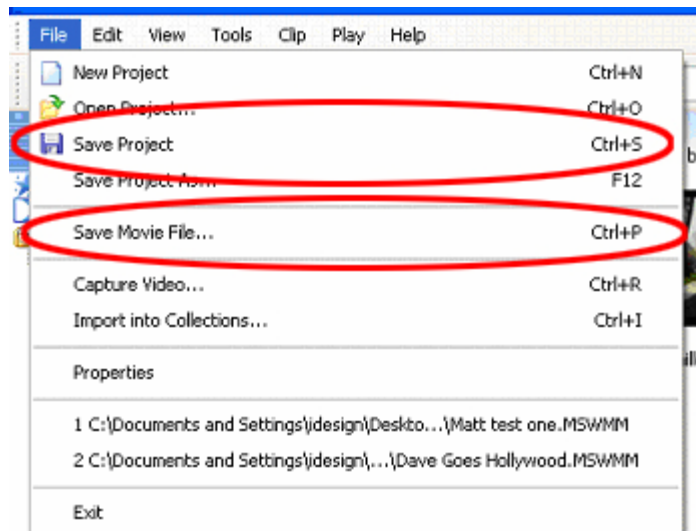
- 2) Select an appropriate transition, and drag it to the timeline. Movie Maker will only allow you to place the transitions between images. Once you have the transition between the appropriate images, let go of the mouse button.

- 3) The transition can be of any length. First select the transition, by clicking on its descriptor in the Transition part of the timeline. Move the mouse to the left of the transition until you have the message "Click and Drag to trim the clip". Drag the mouse toward the left to make the transition longer, and drag to the right to make it shorter. If you drag too far right, you will delete the transition.



- 4) Repeat steps 2-5 as necessarily until you are done.

- 5) If this is all that you are doing, and you wish to be able to edit this movie in the future, select the File menu, and select Save Project. Give the file a name, and navigate to a folder to store it.



- 6) If you wish to turn this file into a playable movie, select the File menu, and select Save Movie File.... Select where you would like to place the file, and click next. Then, follow the on screen directions.
