

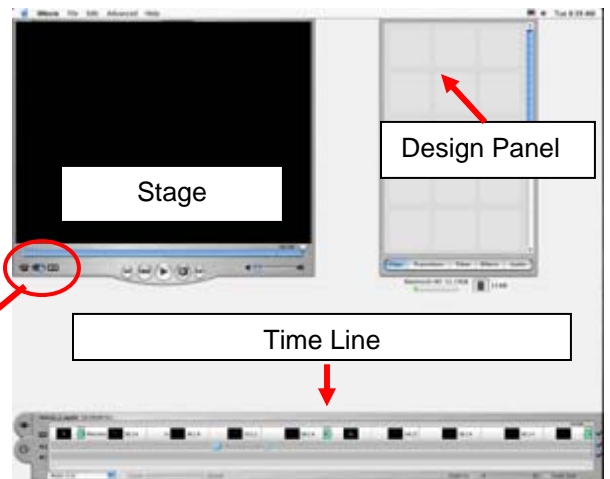
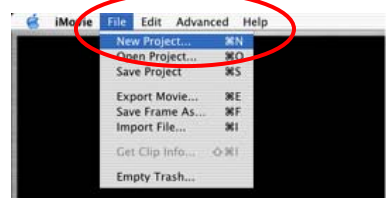
Importing digital video into a new iMovie project and exporting the final project to camera or to Quicktime.

13 Steps

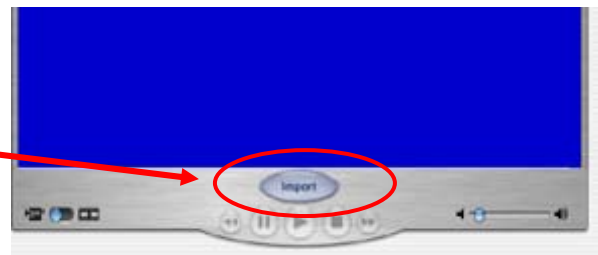
This Step-by-Step explains the procedures for printing a specific range of pages from an Adobe Acrobat document viewed on a Macintosh computer.

This Step-by-Step assumes that the iMovie application is already open.

- 1) Open a new iMovie project by selecting **File > New Project** from the dropdown menu.
- 2) When the program opens the desktop will have three work areas; **Stage**, **Design Panel** and **Timeline**.
- 3) To import video from your digital video camera, connect your camera to the computer using the instructions supplied with your digital video camera.
- 4) Once the camera is connected, slide the mode selector located at the lower left corner of the stage to the video camera image.



- 5) The **Stage** screen will turn blue. To begin importing your video, depress the **Import** button.



- 6) Once iMovie starts importing the video from the camera, the **Stage** will change to display the video being imported and a clip will appear in the design panel.



- As iMovie notices changes in the video scene it will create another video clip and add it to the Design Panel. When ready to stop importing the video, depress the **Import** button again and the importing process will end.

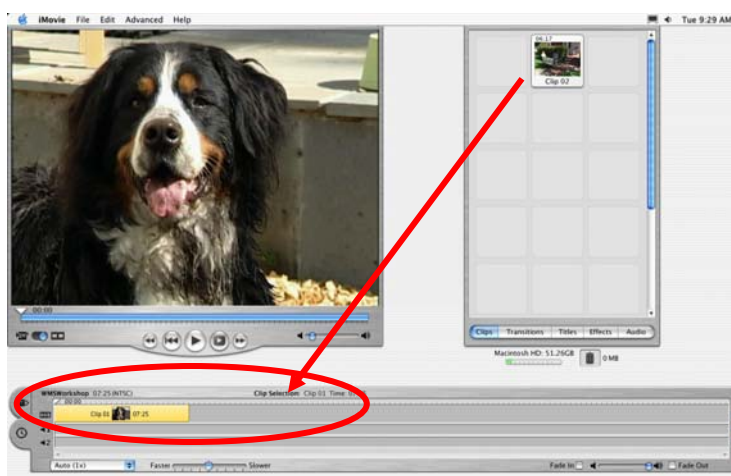


- Once the video is imported into iMovie choose **File > Save**

Adding the clips to the Timeline

- Click and drag a clip from the Design Panel to the Timeline

- The clip will appear highlighted and the first frame of the clip will appear in Stage display. To play the clip, depress the Play arrow, when the arrow is highlighted it is playing. Press the Play arrow again to un-highlight it and stop playing the clip.

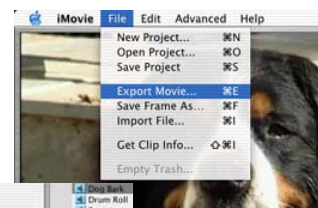


- To add another clip, drag the clip from the Design Panel on to the stage. To rearrange the clips, click on the clip in the timeline and drag it to the front or rear of an existing clip.

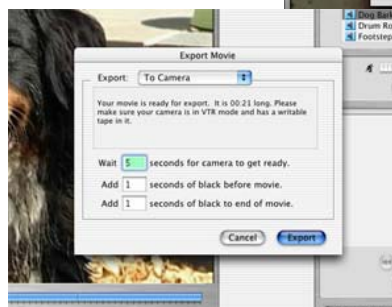
Exporting a Movie to Camera

Once an iMovie is created it must be exported from iMovie before it can be shown in another application.

- To export the iMovie to the camera, choose **File > Export Movie**



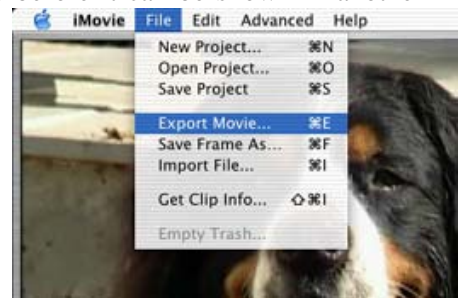
- An Export Movie options dialog box will appear. From the Export dropdown box choose **To Camera**; leave the remaining options and depress the **Export** button.



Exporting a Movie to Quicktime

Once an iMovie is created, it must be exported from iMovie before it can be shown in another application.

- 1) To export the iMovie to the camera, choose **File > Export Movie**
- 2) An Export movie options dialog box will appear. From the Export dropdown box choose **To Quicktime**



Select the type and size movie you would like to create and the **Export** button.
