

Call for papers: Food, place and space

Carole Counihan is soliciting papers for Slow on the topic of “food, place and space.” Slow is the quarterly magazine of the International Slow Food Movement which is published in five languages and distributed to 70,000 members worldwide. Edited and published by Carlo Petrini, founder of the Slow Food Movement, it is directed by Alberto Capatti out of its international offices in Bra, Italy. Carole Counihan is on Slow's editorial advisory board.

Articles should address the following: What roles do places and spaces, both social and architectural, play in the production, distribution and consumption of food? How does the design and location of kitchens, markets, farms, urban gardens, restaurants, cafeterias, food processing spaces, and so on, affect people's relationship to food, labor, nature, and each other? How do food places and spaces contribute to or detract from the goals of Slow Food?

Articles should be written in a clear and lively journalistic style suitable for an educated international audience. They should be 2-5 pages, 600-1500 words total. Articles should be jargon-free and have very few references, which should be incorporated in the text wherever possible. Articles that are accepted for publication are paid at the rate of 77,50 euro (approximately \$80) per page of 300 words per page.
