Millersville University defines an online course as one that meets completely online via online courseware system (i.e. Blackboard, eCollege or WebCT). Effective, Summer 2007
ESCI 245 – Environmental Meteorology (G2, L lecture/lab course)	The department has adapted existing course, ESCI 245 for web/online delivery format. Millersville University defines an online course as one that meets completely online via online courseware system (i.e. Blackboard, eCollege or WebCT). Effective, Summer 2007

PHIL 100 – Introduction to Philosophy (G1)	The department has adapted existing course, PHIL 100 for online delivery following a blended distance learning format. A blended course would be one that requires some face-to-face class meetings along with some classes offered via distance education – either via online, videoconferencing or independent study. Effective, Summer 2007
PSYC 318 – Psychology of Racism (P)	<p>The department has adapted existing course, PSYC 318 for delivery following a <b>blended distance learning format only</b>. A blended course would be one that requires some face-to-face class meetings along with some classes offered via distance education – either via online, videoconferencing or independent study. The Undergraduate Course and Program Review Committee (UCPRC) has approved PSYC 318, which is designated as a “P” course, to be offered only in the blended distance learning format.</i></p>
