Dear Prospective Graduate Student:

Thank you for your interest in Millersville University. The University was established in 1854 and is one of the oldest of the fourteen schools in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. Rated one of the finest regional Universities in the country in several recent professional publications, Millersville has a tradition in graduate and post-baccalaureate education that dates back more than half a century.

The University has several dozen international students currently enrolled in graduate degree programs. In addition to our commitment to academic excellence, we strongly support cultural diversity and international exchange programs. We encourage and welcome your contribution to university life after successfully completing the admissions process.

As an international student, it is important that you understand all of the University and departmental requirements in your degree program. I encourage you to carefully examine the Graduate Catalog (available by mail or at www.millersville.edu/~graduate) and any ancillary materials about your intended program of study. In addition to taking the GRE or MAT or GMAT (see Testing section of Catalog for specific program requirements), you must also take the TOEFL examination and achieve a minimum score of 500. In addition to having your *official* academic transcripts in native language and English translation submitted in a sealed envelope from the institution, you must also have your *official* academic credentials sent to a recognized credential evaluation service for evaluation. Two such services are: The American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers at www.AACRAO.org or the World Education Services, Inc. at www.WES.org. The credential evaluation service should mail the evaluation directly to our office. If you have any questions about applying, I encourage you to contact my office by email or telephone (717-872-3099).

You should also know that international students must submit information which demonstrates that they possess the financial resources to attend Millersville University. All international students are treated as out-of-state residents for purposes of assessing tuition fees. I enclose for your benefit a packet of information which includes the schedule of fees and the necessary financial verification form. Admission to the University will be contingent upon satisfying all academic requirements, and receipt of a properly completed financial verification form.
