

Questions and Answers:

Who is required to live on campus?

All students with less than 60 credits attempted are required to live on campus. See Part I of the Housing Contract.

What is the duration of the Housing Contract?

One (1) academic year – Fall 2009 semester and Spring 2010 semester.

Are all residence halls coed?

Yes. All residence halls are coed.

May I reside in Bard, Gaige, Harbold, or Hull Hall for the 2009/2010 academic year?

No. These halls will be occupied by incoming freshman to the University for the 2009/2010 academic year.

If I am currently living in a Premium Room (single/single, room with bathroom) will I automatically get it back next semester?

No. You must complete a Premium Room Contract to apply for your room for the 2010/2011 academic year. Completing a Premium Room Contract does not guarantee you will be housed in the same room.

What if I do not complete a Premium Room Contract for my current room or any other Premium Room?

You will forfeit your room and forfeit any chance of receiving a Premium Room.

What if I am not called or awarded a Premium Room?

Continue with the Lottery Process.

May I select an incoming student as a roommate?

Yes. You may request an incoming student as long as they request to reside with you via an email during room selection.

May I select someone on the Special Billing List as a roommate?

Yes. You may select a student from the Special Billing List if the Special Billing student requested has paid a housing deposit and selected you as a roommate on the Special Billing form or called the Housing Office and requested you as a roommate.

Students who are on the Special Billing List are students on a University approved Leave of Absence (i.e., study abroad, medical leave, etc.).

If I would like to reside in a designated triple or quad, do I need to have two or three roommates at the time of selection?

Yes. If you want to claim a vacant triple or quad, you must have the required number of roommates to fill the room.

If I do not have a roommate preference, how will you determine my roommate?

We will be consolidating all students during the Room Selection Process. If you are sitting alone in a room, the first person to request the hall you have chosen will be placed with you in that room.

If after the room selection process is completed, and when I receive my housing assignment letter in July, may I telephone my assigned roommate and tell them they will have to move at the beginning of the semester?

No. This action will result in a discipline violation.

When am I permitted to make a room change?

There is a freeze on room changes at the beginning of each semester. After the freeze period, the GA will inform you when in-hall and out-of-hall changes will begin.

What room furniture is provided?

All residence halls are equipped with beds, dressers, closets, and desks for each student in a room.

Should I purchase regular twin or extra-long sheets?

The mattresses in all the halls are 80-inch-long.

If I require a medical accommodation, should I indicate my need on the Housing Contract Card?

All requests for medical accommodations must be made through Learning Services in Lyle Hall by **May 1** for the fall semester and **December 1** for the spring semester. You may contact Learning Services at (717)872-3178.

In the event of overflow housing, will there be furniture in the room for each of the students?

In double rooms, an extra bed and desk will be placed in the room if overflow housing is necessary.

When will I be moved out of overflow housing?

As students withdraw from the residence halls, the Department of Housing and Residential Programs will reassign you to a permanent room.
