Regulations Governing Minor Course Work:

1. Must earn a C- or better in INTL 201: Introduction to International Studies.
2. Must successfully complete 75 credits before enrolling in INTL 488: Senior Seminar.
3. Completion of all University curricular requirements, including a minimum Millersville QPA of 2.0 in the minor.
4. At least two courses should be at the upper-division level (300-400).
5. Students desiring more in-depth study of particular topics may register for INTL 491: Topics in International Studies (1-6 c.h.) and INTL 498: Independent Study (1-6 c.h.). Students may also register for seminar, topics, and contemporary issues courses from various departments that change from semester to semester. These latter courses, along with the topics and independent study credits, may count under any of the minor field categories with the approval of the Coordinator of the International Studies Program.
6. Minors are strongly encouraged to study abroad. Study abroad courses and foreign internship experiences may be counted toward the requirements of the minor with the approval of the Coordinator of the International Studies Program.
