Planning for Millersville's Future

New attitude, new emphasis
mean no more shelves full
of dusty goals and objectives.

Mention the task of writing goals and objectives and one usually hears groans. It is not a popular activity and that's true at colleges and universities as well as at most organizations.

But, planning has been on the front burner at Millersville for the last two years, serving as the vehicle for addressing the University's future. Some visible results have improved the popularity of the annual assignment to prepare next year's goals and have demonstrated to almost everyone that planning is the key to the future.

Shortly after becoming Millersville's president, Dr. Joseph Caputo began talking about the need for creating an office to give direction to the formal activity of planning. He saw Millersville's potential for becoming a more fully integrated part of Lancaster County. But, he also read the demographics about declining numbers of college-aged citizens.

By preparing for the future, both in the long range and the short range, he felt that Millersville could remain strong despite the demographics. But, to get there would require planning, shaping, thinking and direction.

Two years ago, his ideas resulted in a giant jump in planning activities. The office of planning was established and Mrs. Linda Suskie, a professional in the field of planning, was employed to help all units of the University do wise planning.

Out of the first two years came a written statement of Millersville's mission. Writing that statement involved many personalities, many different ideas and a wide range of academic and educational biases. After months of meetings and discussions, a formal Mission Statement was produced that is intended to be the foundation for planning for at least the next decade. Also developed last year was the University's first statement of strategic directions, which are institutional-wide goals. This is a document that will be updated as needed, probably once a year.

Today, Millersville administrators are still writing goals and objectives, but the assignment meets less resistance for several reasons.

One, the University is serious now about planning and everyone knows it.

Two, suggested goals are read, move through an approval process, and lead to visible results.

And three, the task is now part of a broader process called strategic planning that gives every faculty member and administrator within the University a chance to speculate about the future of Millersville.

President Caputo and Mrs. Suskie shared their feelings about the planning procedure at Millersville as it has developed and what each of them sees ahead for Millersville. Their views follow on the next pages.

President Caputo Gives Planning Top Priority Across Campus

“What’s important about planning is not the plan, but the process.”

That’s President Joseph Caputo’s understanding now about planning for Millersville University’s future. It comes after two years of intense involvement with planning, a period in which Millersville dealt with long-range goals in writing its “mission” and with short-range goals in developing a statement of strategic directions.

“I’ve come to see that planning is a humanistic activity. It is a constant process of meetings, of discussions, of assessing external constraints and internal problems, as well as opportunities and strengths,” Caputo relates.

“Many people on campus had

the idea that the planning process would be very mechanical, loaded with paperwork and that it would

be very systematic, very precise and scientific.

“What we’re finding is that planning seems to work best if it is more cultural in nature, if it is more discussion-oriented, if the people involved are the integrating and decision-making forces, if there is less paperwork.”

As the chief executive officer, President Caputo’s role in planning is to synthesize proposals from across campus as well as data on the community to make decisions about the future of the University. He works in consultation with his cabinet, the President’s Advisory Council, with the various campus committees involved with planning and with the planning officer. But, in the final analysis, it is the University president who must be

Through all of its programs, Millersville University will provide students with opportunities for academic, personal, social, and cultural growth essential to the development of an educated and productive person.

While Millersville University recognizes excellence in teaching and the cultivation of minds as its reason for being, the University also accepts its responsibility to provide opportunities for research, artistic and scholarly effort, and other creative endeavors in a manner consistent with its primary mission as a teaching institution. Additionally, the University accepts its responsibility to serve society by acting as a resource for businesses and agencies.

Toward these ends, the

Millersville University community pledges itself to academic freedom and to the nurturing of an environment designed to stimulate imagination and curiosity, encourage unfettered discourse, tolerate divergent and controversial opinion, enhance multicultural awareness and understanding, and foster mutual respect and cooperation among its members.

The Millersville University community acknowledges that the realization of the ideals set forth in this Mission requires the commitment of a large and diverse group of people who, in spite of differing academic specialties, interests, and styles, are of a common mind concerning the importance and value of a liberating education. The University community affirms that it is the process of learning and the intellectual and moral maturation accompanying it that are to be valued and pursued.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS FOR 1986

In the coming years, Millersville University seeks to actualize its mission through ten strategic directions.

1. Millersville will enhance the quality of its most important resource, its faculty, through three strategies.

First, it will provide to faculty the human and fiscal support, including staff and facilities, that are essential to enhance both their productivity and the quality of their work.

Second, it will ensure that only faculty of the finest quality who share in the commitment to excellence in instruction will be recruited and retained at the University.

Third, it will develop greater opportunities and support mechanisms for professional development, research, scholarship, and other creative activities.

2. To ensure the strongest and most properly devised academic degree programs possible, Millersville will complete a comprehensive review of the curriculum and amend it as necessary.
3. Because Millersville is committed to meeting Commonwealth needs consistent with the University's mission, it will assess the demand for new academic programs, attempting to anticipate needs as or before they develop, and initiate new programs in a timely fashion.
4. Consistent with its emphasis on baccalaureate programs, associate and graduate programs will be of-

fered only in areas where Millersville has unusual strength and quality or where there is evidence of intense regional needs that would be unconscionable to ignore.

5. Because it is essential that all University programs be subject to critical review if they are to achieve greater excellence, Millersville will regularly review all programs to ensure quality, responsiveness to community and social needs, and a strong foundation in the liberal arts.
6. In order to sustain admission and retention and to provide students with opportunities for individual growth and development, Millersville will strengthen and expand its student life programs.
7. Millersville will further enhance the racial, ethnic, and cultural diversity of its students, faculty and staff, and campus atmosphere.
8. Millersville will maintain its traditional admissions standards and strive to maintain its current size.
9. Millersville will expand its resources through legislative initiatives consistent with State System of Higher Education policies and by means of its own advancement program, thereby providing a combination of public and private support to the University.
10. Millersville will strive for wider public understanding and acceptance of its mission and greater recognition of the quality of its programs.

Strategic Planning Includes Study of Environment



Mrs. Linda A. Suskie is a graduate of Johns Hopkins University and holds a master's degree in measurement and statistics from the University of Iowa. She held teaching and administrative positions at Stockton State College, New Jersey and the State University of New York at Oswego prior to joining the Millersville staff as assistant to the president for planning in 1984.

Mrs. Linda Suskie, assistant to the president for planning, has responsibility for designing and directing Millersville's planning procedures, preparing background material for planning decision-making and training the campus community on how to plan.

She came to Millersville two years ago from the State University of New York at Oswego where she was director of institutional research. She brought with her a commitment to the value of strategic planning, a different way of looking at planning which is more broad and far more challenging than the tedious list making of goals and objectives that usually go unread but constitute the planning process at many institutions.

We asked Suskie, what is the difference between garden variety planning and strategic planning?

The primary new ingredient in

strategic planning is environmental data, she explained. "At Millersville, that means looking at what's going on now or may be going on in the future in the Lancaster community, at what's going on in higher education across the country and at what's going on within the state in terms of governmental and economic trends."

Also, examining the environment, she says, includes discovering what's important and what will be important to students. "It means finding out which majors are the up-and-coming programs that students will be demanding in the next decade and finding out the demands of the marketplace for graduates."

The planning and evaluating program used widely by many companies, "management by objectives" (MBO), had been in place at Millersville when Suskie

willing to try the untried, to take the risks, to demonstrate vision and to push forward in ways that might mold the University forever.

"The most important and most lasting effect of the planning process is that we have become more future-minded," Caputo believes.

"Going through the process helps us make some determinations about what Millersville would like to be and where we would like to go. Then, based on various global and societal trends and on assessments regarding our available resources, we try to shape our future."

Caputo emphasizes that planning is a continuous process.

"Each year, we need to rethink and rediscuss the assumptions in light of new information. Planning is, in part, a mental state. It is definitely not static but a very dynamic process and it has a lot to do with attitude and point of view. It must be future oriented."

And what about the future of Millersville? Dr. Caputo thinks it is tied very closely to the future of Lancaster County.

"An important part of the planning process is keeping one's mind and ears open. We've gone

out, as part of our fund raising program, to talk to the business community and, I think for the first time in our history, a very important and very powerful business community is becoming aware that there is a major university in its midst that is a valuable resource.

"This new awareness has resulted in faculty being hired as consultants, in internships and jobs for our students and graduates and several substantial gifts from companies that recognize the value of our contributions to the community.

"We've told the local business world that it is our intention to serve them, so now they're telling us what they need. They say they need more instruction in engineering and in technology. We have some offerings in these areas, but we don't have enough.

"I hear the same questions all of the time—when I go to business luncheons, when I interact with businessmen individually. They all ask: 'When are you guys going to have an engineering program? When are you going to offer electrical engineering? When are you going to expand your continuing education opportunities in technological fields?'

"It is obvious that if you tell people you are here to serve, they'll tell you what they need. And we must listen. But, frankly, I am surprised about the demand for engineering programs and somewhat puzzled about how to proceed.

was hired. Across the campus, many administrators used MBO to plan the next year and evaluate the last one. She examined how Millersville was doing planning then and saw three primary problems.

First, goals were being set for only one year. There was no formal long-range planning process.

Second, the MBO process had no relation to the budget process. As a result, many participants thought writing goals was a useless exercise because what really was important were those requests approved in the separate budget proposal.

The third problem was that, in the academic areas, the task of writing goals and objectives went down only to the deans' level. Faculty and department chairpersons were not involved.

"I made the mistake of trying to solve all three problems the first year," she says now as she looks back on last year. "I required a separate form for each objective and another for the funding request. The result was that everyone felt overwhelmed with the paperwork. I have to admit that, by the time we got through, we had two full volumes of material from across the campus—it was almost impossible for the executive staff to get through them all, even in two full-day meetings.

"I simplified the procedure so that each department's objectives and funding requests were on the same page."

"So this past year, I simplified the procedures so that each department's objectives and funding requests were on the same page. However, I did insist that we continue to involve department faculty and all middle managers."

With the directions now only a page and a half, Suskie says that her printed materials are as simple as possible and she feels that her mechanics of planning are now in place. So her own goal in 1987 will be to expand the number of day-long training workshops to include all department chairpersons and staff from nonacademic areas.

During training workshops, Suskie discusses planning, specifically the elements of strategic planning, and helps staff members incorporate environmental information into their goal setting.

"College presidents often are accused of having delusions of grandeur and being constant advocates for more and bigger—more money, more programs. I don't think we have a lot of credibility with some folks in Harrisburg when we say we need an engineering program. They kind of roll their eyes back and say 'Oh God, here comes President So and So. All he wants is more money and a bill passed for an engineering building and that's ridiculous.' "

Caputo believes Millersville's ability to offer more programs in technology will help determine the future of Lancaster County itself.

"Lancaster is enormously dynamic and unusually robust economically. It has a powerful agricultural base which is very productive and profitable and a growing general business environment, especially a growing high-tech industry that requires a local university with sophisticated programs in technology, engineering, computer science, business, science and the arts.

"I recognize that most of these are expensive areas. Technology isn't cheap, engineering isn't

cheap, computer science isn't cheap. But sociological and economic studies tell us that no city, no county, really moves forward with rapid and continuous expansion for long without a very strong educational base.

"Lancaster County is a wonderful area. Its unemployment rate is one of the lowest in the nation and its growth rate is one of the fastest in Pennsylvania. Obviously, Lancaster County is a hot bed and any place that is a hot bed has a major university. I think Millersville has the potential of being that institution.

"Lancaster County and Millersville University can move together in concert over the next 25 years. But if Millersville is either not able to keep pace or not allowed to keep pace, then I think the economic development of Lancaster County will be compromised."

And why wouldn't Millersville be able to keep moving with Lancaster County?

Caputo explains that the people who would be able to help—the local state legislators—all of whom are very supportive of economic growth in Lancaster County and who would most likely be very supportive of Millersville Univer-

sity's role of serving the county, are not in a position to do anything for Millersville directly.

That's because Millersville is part of the State System of Higher Education.

"The system is a support, in that it provides us much of our strength and nurturing, but at the same time it constrains and restrains us from growing at a rate more rapid than the system at large," Caputo reflects. "That's a particular problem for us because Lancaster County is growing faster than the rest of the state."

Caputo says this problem becomes a factor in planning for the future. "We're not entirely masters of our own fate. We don't have complete control. In fact, we only have a little bit of control.

"Some argue that doing planning, when you have such little control, is foolish. They're very fatalistic about it. Why bother? But I argue that in the middle of a storm is the worst time to let go of the rudder. Let's do the best we can. Let's control as much as we can. Whether we get a new degree program, the money to initiate that program, or whether we get a new building all depends on

She says that increasing the number of workshops is an effort to take the pain out of planning. "Professionals from the planning field," she says, "realize that most people feel threatened by the planning process and they advise that planners not develop planning manuals or distribute excessive directions or forms." It is much easier for people to understand the importance and elements of strategic planning in a session where they can ask questions, she added.

"Everyone likes the workshops. I present lots of data about the institution and everyone enjoys talking about Millersville and learning some new information. The only problem with the workshop design is the gradual dawning on participants that the planning

expert, in fact, doesn't do the planning—they do.

"Some people think that since the University has a planning professional, they don't need to worry

about planning. One characteristic of my job is that the better job I do, the more work I create for other people. Planning takes time, it takes hard thought. I coordinate the planning process and I support it, but I don't do planning."

Suskie does collect data to help with wise planning. She has done research on the institution and believes she can see fairly objectively its strengths and weaknesses. She also has done research on Millersville students and their attitudes and plans to analyze the Lancaster community. All of the environmental data becomes part of the planning process as each office looks at risks, threats and opportunities.

At a recent workshop held with the University's Student Affairs

whether or not the Commonwealth gives us the money. That is something we can try to influence, but we really can't control.

"It's possible that 25 years from now, this could be a very dynamic community that won't look very much the way it does now. Lancaster County could be quite developed industrially. And Millersville University could be the high-tech center for Lancaster County. That's in the realm of possibility. But maybe not. Looking that far ahead is very difficult to predict and my scientific training makes me reluctant to make predictions."

Dr. Caputo's interest in seeing the University become a high-tech center doesn't lessen his conviction that Millersville must maintain its liberal arts emphasis. "I have made a personal commitment to maintaining Millersville's liberal arts traditions. I think it's a commitment this community wants maintained. Even when we develop new programs in technology, we want them based on a strong liberal arts foundation.

"I'm concerned about the general education of our students, about their general growth and

development as human beings, their becoming competent and contributing citizens, not narrowly trained technicians."

Caputo also recognizes Millersville's long history of excellence as a teacher education institution. "We sometimes forget how important that role is for us, but we need to continue that tradition and, in fact, need to strengthen it.

"I think we are at a transitional time in teacher education. The national mood has changed. The worst reports are over and we're past the period of shrill criticism. There are now constructive reports coming out, identifying initiatives, programs, and positive responses that can be made by institutions. At Millersville the enrollment decline that we've seen in the School of Education has bottomed out. We had been down to a low of about 22 percent of students majoring in education. We're up to 25 percent and the incoming freshman class looks like it will have an even larger percentage.

"We'll now be adding new faculty in education. There are going to be new, young instructors coming in with new ideas, fresh out of graduate school. So this will be a very exciting time for the faculty in the School of Education. They've had a tough time for the past decade and I've felt bad for them. Now I think we are on an upbeat note and it is time for us to move forward with innovative changes in our own curriculum and in assisting the public schools with their initiatives."

Caputo says the University's

staff, she shared with them a picture of the Millersville student.

"This staff knows a lot about this subject because they work with students, so I was surprised at their reaction. I talked for two hours and they were enthralled. They told me they learned so much."

What was so fascinating about Suskie's data on MU students?

First, she says that Millersville students are much better prepared academically than students nationally; they take more course work in academic subjects in high school; they have better high school grades and higher SAT scores. That surprises some people.

Also, according to a survey she made, Millersville students are not especially conservative, as many

assume. Compared to national norms, they are, in fact, typical in their political, social and religious views.

Another interesting fact is that only three out of four MU students are full-time undergraduates. One-fourth attend Millersville on a part-time basis, either as undergraduate or graduate students. Suskie believes this impressed the Student Affairs staff members and led to their setting a goal to provide better services for the non-traditional student.

A common misconception about our students, she reports, is that most of them are first generation college students. In truth, almost half of the fathers and 30 percent of the mothers have been to college. Today a good proportion of

MU students are children of teachers, business people, nurses, middle managers, etc.

Millersville doesn't get many students from either end of the economic scale—very few from low income and almost none from high income homes. "I think Millersville's commitment to developing more scholarship money grows out of our concern for providing opportunities for more low-income students," she stated.

In order to do planning, one must study and understand the institution and Suskie has spent a great deal of time at that. "I've uncovered a lot of what I call 'gee whiz information'," Mrs. Suskie explains. "It's not something that leads to developing new programs,

new Mission Statement and its first strategic direction statement both address some very important issues.

"Part of planning is to be opportunistic, but to recognize which opportunities fit into the cohesive sense of the plan and which don't, to be able to say no to some things and yes to others. As part of our planning process, we have developed a Mission Statement which I think is really quite good. It does not try to be all things to all people and I think it characterizes Millersville in a general way and that's what a Mission Statement should do. It sets us apart from other institutions. It has some distinction.

"We've had to look at a number of nagging questions: Where are we going with the graduate programs? Where are we going with the associate degree programs? What does University status mean? Where are we going with regard to our role as a community college, with our public service component?"

"Our statements, I think, take some strong and somewhat courageous steps in terms of trying to narrow the field and answer

some of these questions. We have said that we are a teaching University—that is our first priority, that is the nature of this institution. It is our purpose to become the finest undergraduate institution that we can.

"With regard to graduate and associate degree programs, we have said that we shall offer these programs only where we have

unusual academic strength or where there is such pressing regional need for a program that it would be unconscionable to overlook the offering.

"Providing associate degrees in those areas where there is an intense regional need is one way we fulfill our community college responsibilities, because there's not a community college in Lancaster County. Another way we meet that responsibility is by admitting students in a continuing education capacity who would not normally meet regular admissions requirements. They may commute to Millersville, take a limited number of courses and, if they're successful, can become regularly matriculated students.

"For a couple of years, we wrestled with the problem of how to serve the needs of downtown Lancaster. We talked about the possibility of opening an evening branch on a site downtown. But, we got very little response that would suggest that anyone else would be willing to help pay for such an initiative or that there's any real demand for a Millersville branch in downtown Lancaster.

"However, there are other ways

but it's fascinating and helps us understand the institution."

During Suskie's first year, her primary activities were developing a planning procedure and helping the University write its Mission Statement. About the statement, she says "I think it is an exceptionally fine piece of work. For the next decade or so, all of Millersville's planning ought to come out of the principles espoused in that document.

"Also developed last year was a set of strategic directions, which are essentially University-wide goals. Although the Mission Statement is semi-permanent, the strategic directions will be revised every year as new needs are seen and changes take place within the institution and within

the environment."

In the role of planner, Mrs. Suskie studies Millersville "from a data point of view. It's important that I look at Millersville objectively. Perhaps it has been helpful that, as a relative newcomer, I am somewhat an outsider. With that view, and after studying Millersville, I can honestly say that I believe we have the best school in the State System of Higher Education.

"Millersville has a high number of very strong programs and we appear to be seen as a quality school. I've been able to identify from the data which other colleges compete for our students. In addition to nearby state universities, many of our incoming freshmen apply also to such respected schools as Penn State,

Elizabethtown, the University of Delaware, Lehigh, Drexel, and Villanova. We're getting some very good students.

"Our rate of applicants in the area of elementary education is astounding. Of all college-bound seniors in Pennsylvania, about three percent apply to Millersville. But among elementary education majors, between six and seven percent apply to Millersville. That's a high percentage and says a lot about our reputation in elementary education.

"Our physics department is one of the most respected in the state. In fact, all of our sciences programs are strong." Recognizing that as a strength of the institution has led to developing a proposal now before the Board of Governors

to serve the Lancaster community. I think the new affiliation agreement to provide the BSN degree for nursing students at Lancaster General Hospital is indirectly related to the planning process because it was clear from our understanding of where we are going that this was a program that we would very much want. When the opportunity came, we leaped at it.

"That program, as well as a similar program with St. Joseph Hospital, is perhaps a template for other kinds of cooperative programs. The hospital agreements provide a smooth way for nurses to earn the RN at the same time they earn credits toward their BSN at Millersville. It seems to me that kind of program provides the total package that one thinks of in a community college offering: an RN certificate program on-site downtown, combined with an accredited BSN program without any loss of time by transferring to a four-year college. We have accomplished that.

"Now, we're in the very early phase of discussions with the area vocational schools to see whether we might offer an associate

degree program in concert with them. Students can attend that institution, also take the appropriate liberal arts courses at Millersville and earn an associate's degree in various areas of applied science and technology.

"We may also be able to develop programs with Stevens Technical Institute for cooperative degrees and we're in discussions now with the Pennsylvania School of the Arts, which is in the process of moving from Marietta to downtown Lancaster, to have an integrated program with them resulting in a BFA here at Millersville. So I think that what we see for the future is that we will not open branch campuses, but we will affiliate with appropriate professional and trade institutions, and provide students with a very well-designed opportunity, equivalent to a community college.

"With this design, we would be meeting our responsibilities to provide some community college services, but without stretching ourselves too thinly, without trying to be all things to all people, and by keeping the center of Millersville here on campus where we can

do these things most efficiently.

"I think these are important decisions that arose from discussions in the planning process and from an understanding of where we are going and what we need to be doing to shape this definition of the University. Do we abandon associate degree programs? As a University, do we abandon a community college concept? Our answer is 'no, we don't abandon them but we reshape them.' What do we do about graduate programs? Do we add graduate programs just to add graduate programs because we are now a University? The answer is 'no, we don't do that.' We provide programs in a carefully considered way, out of strength and out of need, but not as an end in itself as some would have us do."

A major new thrust at Millersville—one that has grown out of the planning process—is the effort to raise a sizeable amount of private funds from contributing alumni, employees, foundations, businesses and other friends of the University. After three years of University-directed fund raising, next year the University will move in a new direction.

to designate Millersville's School of Science and Mathematics as a "Sphere of Excellence" in the State System.

"Our foreign language program is one of the strongest in the state," she believes. "I am excited about the possibility of a new emphasis in international studies, or perhaps a major or concentration in international business, combining foreign language and business programs."

So what's down the road for Millersville? According to Suskie, certainly enrollment decline, but perhaps only a slight one.

"I'm afraid I'm one of the few people on campus who believe this is really going to happen. But it very likely may. If Millersville keeps doing the outstanding job it

is now doing in admissions, in developing new programs, and in its various public relations efforts,

the decline won't be as serious here as at some schools, but it will come." She says, "It's the planning Millersville does now and the new program initiatives that result from it that will keep us strong through that period."

Mrs. Suskie sees Millersville as an exceptionally healthy institution. "When I came here for my interview, I was surprised at how vibrant Millersville was. Usually it is the problem institution that wants to employ a planner. Millersville had no budget problems, no enrollment problems, had good morale, good location, good array of programs—it seemed to be doing everything right.

"But, at that time, President Caputo indicated concern that Millersville was not moving ahead

"Our new emphasis will be on asking supporters for unrestricted gifts. We're asking donors to become, perhaps, more trusting, to become more sophisticated in their understanding of fund raising, and to understand that there is one University with one set of consistent and coherent values and priorities. We'll use all of our resources, whether they come from the state, the federal government or from private gifts, in support of these same priorities.

"Therefore, the best kind of gift that a contributor can make to the University is an unrestricted gift—a gift that supports University-determined priorities.

"There are several pressing needs that the University has that best can be supported by private funds. One is faculty development. Faculty are truly our principle educational and instructional resource. It should be obvious that without faculty, no teaching or learning goes on. The faculty are becoming grey in the temple at Millersville, as they are in colleges and universities across the United States. They are in the middle of their careers. They're not particularly mobile, nor do we

necessarily want them to be. The opportunity for them to rejuvenate, to remain excited about their work, to see education in their subject areas from different perspectives, is very limited. We need funds to enhance their opportunities for various educational exchanges within the United States and internationally.

"Also, we need more scholarships for bright students. I have commissioned a study to review all of our scholarship programs, particularly some of the older gifts and scholarships, of which there are so many involving small amounts of money, to see if we can develop some cohesiveness, some better system to attract the kinds of students that we want and to support them for four years at Millersville. Again, we would rather have donors give us unrestricted money and let us fund comprehensive scholarship programs than have them establish or contribute to specific scholarships.

"We are also taking a new direction in athletic scholarships. One of the first decisions I made when I became president was to provide greater equality between men's and women's athletics and I did

that organizationally by providing equal organizational standing and equivalent leadership. We created a director of men's athletics and a director of women's athletics, each on equal standing.

"As a consequence of that decision and that structure, women's athletics has really thrived at Millersville. There has been a substantial improvement in facilities, new coaches, and an equal number of men's and women's sports. The women's athletic program is becoming very strong, and people who ought to know tell us that if we continue in the current trend, we are going to have one of the finest women's athletic programs in Pennsylvania. We've taken the tack in women's athletics that we're not going to highlight one or two sports, but that the program comprehensively is what will be visible." All of the women's sports, he added, will receive some limited funds for scholarships.

"The philosophy—the strategy—in men's athletics is much different. The University administration, not without some controversy, decided that we are going to emphasize football and basketball and we're going to put our grants-in-aid for students

with developing new programs—new academic initiatives. Some of that is beginning to happen now. We are developing a computer science engineering program, perhaps a geology engineering program, and we've written the proposal to designate Millersville as a Sphere of Excellence in Science.

"Some new programs are expensive and the lack of resources prevents progress. But creating other programs is just a matter of repackaging. For example, our art department is extremely strong and could put together a major in commercial art by utilizing existing courses and faculty across campus, offering a program that has a definite market without additional expense."

After two years, Suskie says she

feels optimistic about the future of Millersville. "I've compared notes with planners at other institutions and have become aware of how lucky we are at Millersville, what a good job we do here, how fortunate we are to be located in an economically strong area and what a bright future we have."

In addition to supporting planning activities, Suskie is in charge of coordinating program review,

something new at Millersville that requires each department and each University office to do an intensive self-study every five years. Each department and office will take a hard look at itself, its strengths and weaknesses. Their findings dovetail in obvious ways with institutional planning.

The mix of internal data, environmental information and knowledge of societal trends with planning leadership and vision will ensure that Millersville University's 130-year history of strength will continue into future centuries. That's why all this attention to planning. It is critical because planning is the future.

only into those sports. Of course, we'll make available the other intercollegiate sports for men, but without the same degree of emphasis."

Caputo explained that this decision means that only scholarship donations specified for a particular men's sport will go to sports other than football and basketball.

"We've been really very rigorous in the way we fund intercollegiate athletics and athletic scholarships at Millersville. We have not used any of the techniques other institutions use of letting money come into the coffers through the back door from profit-making enterprises that are really subsidized by the University. Profit from all of our revenue-generating activities, such as summer camps, vending machines, leasing of facilities, etc., go into the general University fund and are used principally to support academic programs.

"As a consequence, we don't have the amount of funds available to support intercollegiate athletics that many of our competing institutions do. Our plan is to ask the cooperation of alumni and other givers in making unrestricted gifts and to use some of these funds for athletic grants-in-

aid, based on the priorities we have set."

So planning has taken Millersville in new directions. The fund-raising program will have a new emphasis. University personnel will spend more time in self-evaluation, in understanding external pressures and community needs. Now in place is a polished, yet ever-changing, procedure for planning. New programs are under way to address some developing needs of the industrial community and to create some integrated educational programs with other institutions of learning.

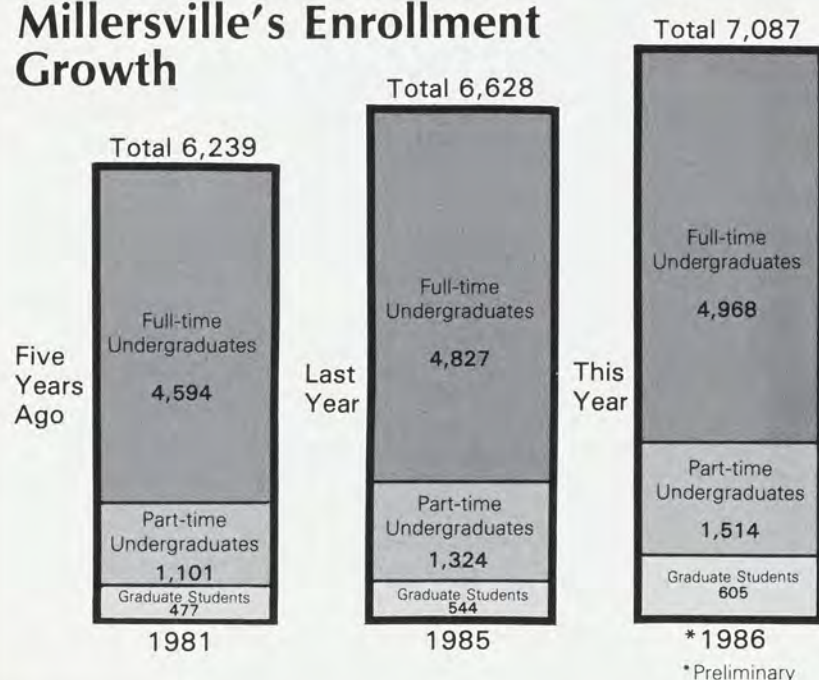
On campus, seeing results from planning has generated a new respect for the task of writing goals and an appreciation for Millersville's impact in the metropolitan area and on its thousands of residents.

Dr. Caputo believes the future looks good for Millersville University.

"It's very difficult to predict, but I think our future is bright. As costs of education increase, it seems that more and more people are opting for public institutions where tuition is more affordable.

"I think it's becoming widely recognized, in part through a public relations campaign that has effectively communicated the realities and qualities of Millersville to the public, that Millersville is, in fact, a great little bargain—that this is a fine institution, a good place to receive an undergraduate education and the cost is low. That, combined with the fact that we are in an area where we can attract a large nontraditional population, and again, because of the robust economy of this population base, things look very good for Millersville for the foreseeable future. I do not see rocks and shoals in the breakers ahead."

Annual Report of Private Gifts

The third year of Millersville University's giving program (July 1, 1985 to June 30, 1986) continued to show remarkable growth, with total private giving of \$867,970, an increase of 66 percent over the previous year.

Highlights of private giving to the University last year came from:

- Clair R. McCollough, Class of '26, with a gift of \$200,000 to the University's Communication and Theatre Department for a Communication Center.
- The estate of Helen Messner, Class of '23, with a bequest of \$195,600 to be used for construction and renovation of the Alumni House.
- The outstanding support of the SICO Foundation for student scholarship awards.
- The estate of Esther Main, Class of '23, with a sum of \$46,629 for endowment to the Ganser Library.
- Millersville alumni contributions that topped the \$100,000 mark for the first time, totaling \$120,317.
- Friends of the University, who doubled the previous year's giving with a sum of \$29,284.
- The first business and industry drive, with a total of \$36,353, including matching gifts.
- The 1986 Senior Class who reinstituted the Senior Class gift with a contribution of \$400 which will be matched by the Alumni Association and used to support renovation of the lake.
- Faculty and staff continued support to the University through the MEDAL Fund, raising \$45,312.

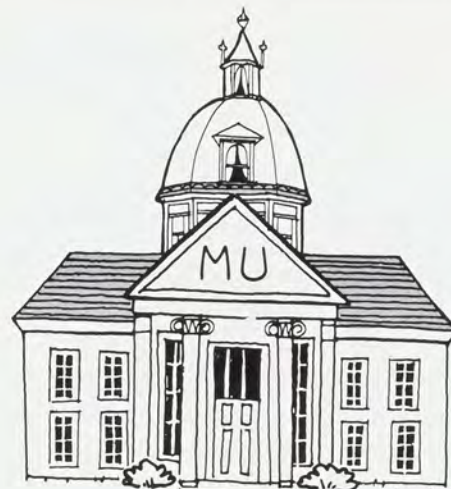

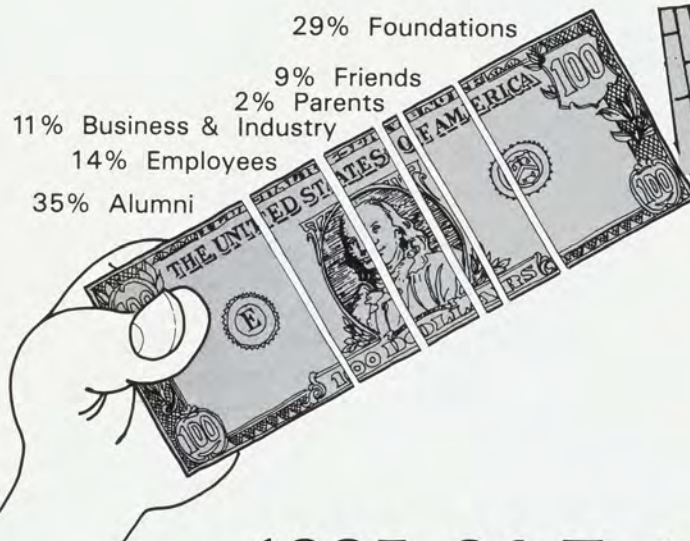

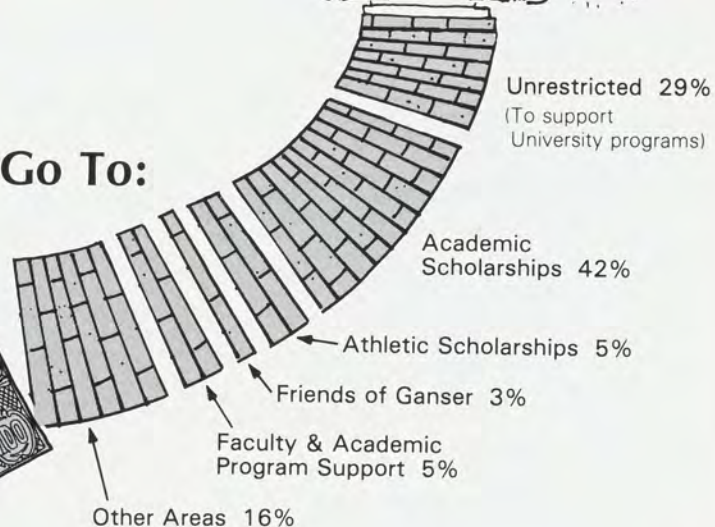
1985-86 Annual Fund Gifts

The MEDAL Fund (Millersville Employees Dedicated to the Advancement of Learning) raised \$45,312 for 1985-86. Twenty-nine percent of faculty and staff and a number of campus organizations contributed \$2,512. Special events and transfers from accounts totaled \$2,800. The contributions support a variety of programs designed to promote excellence within all areas of the University.

The MEDAL Fund began the fiscal year on July 1, 1985 with a balance of \$88,208. Disbursements, including scholarships to outstanding students and awards to faculty and staff, totaled \$40,264. Investments earned interest of \$3,920. The balance on June 30, 1986 was \$99,441.

Gifts to Millersville University Foundation

The Millersville University Foundation for 1985-86 reported total assets of \$917,584, with principal funds of \$850,957, earned income of \$40,370, and operational costs of \$26,257.

In 1980, the Foundation's total assets were \$250,000; since then, interest and dividends have grown from \$21,000 to more than \$50,000 per year. Profits from stocks and bonds since 1980 have totaled \$200,000 and \$460,000 more was contributed by alumni and friends. Endowed gifts to the University during 1985-86 alone totaled \$105,896.

Endowed accounts can be established through the Foundation for a variety of purposes. At present, most support scholarships or award programs. The Foundation is an ideal recipient of bequests and gifts that can be used to establish newly endowed programs or expand current accounts.

Examples of outstanding support to Millersville are major endowed gifts from classes. Currently, the classes of 1927, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938, 1939, 1943 and 1946 have established or are in the process of establishing endowed accounts with the University in recognition of 50th or 60th class reunions.

Creative Giving

In addition to gifts to the Annual Fund and bequests to the Foundation for endowment purposes, a number of flexible and creative methods are available which can help the donor contribute to the University in a way which best meets his or her needs.

Gifts of real estate, such as homes or farms, can be made, with substantial income tax deduction allowed at the time of transfer, but with the donor retaining lifetime right to use of the property. The tax savings on such gifts, in many cases, provides the donor additional annual income.

Life income trust programs, which may involve property, securities or cash gifts, also provide estate tax benefits and allow the donor to use the trust's income during his or her lifetime. The two

basic types of funds are the Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust and the Charitable Remainder Unitrust. In each case, the donor transfers cash or property to a trustee or the University, with the income going to the donor or to a beneficiary for life. The principal becomes available to the University following the death of the life income beneficiary.

Also, gifts of life insurance can be made in several different ways which can benefit the University and provide tax benefits.

1986-87 Annual Fund

"Growing for Tomorrow"

With this theme, the University and the Annual Fund leadership have launched an exciting 1986-87 campaign. A new University Development Committee, staffed by committed volunteers and chaired by William M. McCain '43 of Norristown, has worked closely with University President Caputo and his staff to incorporate the private giving program into the University's planning and budgeting process.

Mr. McCain said that this significant step can be taken because of the Development Committee's confidence that support from alumni, employees, business and industry, friends, and parents will continue to grow. "Our donors demonstrate, through their sustained level of annual giving, a belief that Millersville is an institution of quality," he said.

Recently, President Caputo outlined to the Development Committee the most critical needs for funds, as derived through the University-wide planning process. They are: scholarships and student financial aid, library program development, including Friends of Ganser programs, scholarships for student athletes, new program development in academic departments, development of Student Affairs programs, and development of lectureships.

As a result of this new planning procedure, tying together annual giving and operating budget needs, **unrestricted giving** to the Annual Fund is now encouraged. President Caputo and Chairman McCain agree on the importance of this approach, emphasizing that the ability to direct funds toward the University's primary needs is essential to its future strength.

On behalf of the Development Committee, Mr. McCain announced the 1986-87 goals for overall giving to the University. The target for total private gifts is \$750,000 which includes capital facility support, endowments, and Annual Fund support of \$350,000 to the University's operating budget. The goals for each of these areas are listed below.

Year in Review of the Alumni Association

July 1, 1985 — June 30, 1986

During the past year, the Alumni Association has grown in many ways: more participation, more new faces, and, of course, more new alumni.

But, perhaps most important was its growth in dimension. The Alumni Association has expanded its committee structure to further its program of service to the University.

The major developments of the past year, listed below, indicate both the high level of activity and the move toward increased support of the University.

- New committees were created within the Alumni Association in the areas of career placement, alumni admissions, student-alumni activities, communications, and branch development. These committees will establish plans and goals for the Association to reach during next year.
- The number of branch activities last year increased to eleven, attended by more than 1000 alumni and guests. Regional activities were held in Washington D.C., Lancaster, Philadelphia, Bucks County, York, and in two Florida locations. At each event, University representatives, often President Caputo, attended to apprise

alumni of University activities and plans for the future.

- Three Career Forums on campus brought back alumni to interact with students and discuss professional opportunities in the fields of communications, science and business. The Career Forum program will be continued next year.
- Homecoming '85, held October 26, 1985, brought five hundred alumni to the registration tent at Biemesderfer stadium

and 222 alumni attended the Alumni Dinner Dance.

- Alumni Weekend, May 30 and 31, 1986, was highlighted by a luncheon attended by 340 alumni, the largest attendance in recent years. Also, 209 alumni and guests attended reunion dinners.
- Richard C. Todd '38 received the 1986 Distinguished Service Award. Dr. Todd is professor emeritus from East Carolina University, an author and a bene-

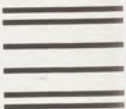

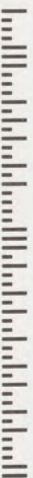
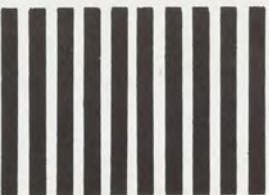
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factor to Millersville University.

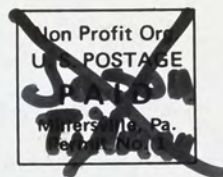
