The Academic and Cultural Enrichment Committee members supervise the distribution of the following alumni endowed and memorial scholarships, which will be awarded to education majors at the Annual Awards Ceremony on campus. If you meet the criteria for any of the following scholarships, you are encouraged to apply.

Any scholarship that demonstrates financial aid requires that the student must have a FAFSA filed in the financial aid office to be considered.

CLASS OF 1927 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP – TBA

A sophomore student who has completed 45 credit hours, who demonstrates great aptitude and ability to teach, and who participates in University activities especially intercollegiate sports. This student must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0.

CLASS OF 1937 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP – TBA

Awarded to a first semester senior (approximately 90 credits hours completed) whose intention is to enter the teaching profession. This student must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5.

CLASS OF 1940 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP TBA

Awarded to a major in education who demonstrates financial need. Evidence of participation in University and professional activities must be presented. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 is required.

CLASS OF 1942 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP – TBA

Awarded annually to an outstanding student majoring in Education, who has achieved academic excellence and demonstrated financial need.

CLASS OF 1943 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP – TBA

Awarded to an education major that has earned a total of 96 credit hours with a grade point average of 3.0 or better, and shows exceptional potential as a classroom teacher. Graduating seniors are not eligible for this award.

FRIENDS AND CLASS OF 1944 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP – TBA

Awarded annually to a student enrolled in the College of Education and Human Services who has completed at least 60 credits by the end of the Fall 2016 semester. Preference shall be given to students in need of financial aid to enable them to continue their studies.

CLASS OF 1952-TBA

This award is for the University Bookstore to purchase books and supplies.

E. KATHRYN MILLER KRAYBILL SCHOLARSHIP - TBA

Awarded to a student with financial need and majoring in education.

DR. SAMEUL P. WALLACE'41 SCHOLARSHIP_TBA

Awarded to a rising junior or senior education major with financial need with a GPA of 3.0; higher Math first preference, science second.

DON L. and IRENE M. HELSEL Memorial Award -TBA

Awarded to a rising junior or senior student (having earned a minimum of 60 credits) in a teacher preparation program in the College of Education and Human Services. First preference is for a student from an under-represented population whose intention is to teach in an urban setting as demonstrated by participation in a program focused on teaching in an urban educational environment. If such intention cannot be met, the scholarship may be awarded to any student from an under-represented population in the College of Education and Human Services. Recipient chosen on basis of excellence in scholarship and leadership as demonstrated by participation in school and community activities. Financial need will also be a consideration. Should a junior student be selected this scholarship may be renewed provided that that the criteria continue to be successfully met.

GENE HUMMEL SCHOLARSHIP- TBA

Awarded to a junior education major that is a Lancaster County resident who graduated from a local high school and has financial need. Funded by the Lancaster County Chapter of Pennsylvania Association of School Retirees.

EUGENE K. ROBB MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – TBA

Awarded to a graduate student in education on the basis of academic achievement and for their contributions to the field of education.
