Millersville and Shippensburg Universities are jointly offering a Master of Social Work (MSW) degree program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). It is designed for applicants who have earned their Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree as well as for career changers. The program was developed to support both the full-time student and the working professional. State-of-the-art technology permits students to acquire social work knowledge, skills and values through multiple educational methods, including traditional campus classes, teleconferencing and web-based activities. Because this is a joint program, students benefit from the quality faculty and resources of both universities.

Dual Degree Admission

Students seeking the dual degree must be formally admitted to the MSW/MEdSM program. Students may start in the MSW program and apply to the dual degree program at any time during their first year in the MSW program.

Flexible Program Options

Regular Standing (BSW or non BSW students)

The dual MSW/MEdSM program offers a variety of flexible full and part time options for degree completion.

Advanced Standing (BSW students only)

Applicants who hold a BSW degree from a CSWE accredited institution and who meet other admission requirements may be eligible for the Advanced Standing program.

Internships

Students will take part in social work and sport focused internship opportunities throughout their course of study.
