Thank you for joining us on this journey. With your support and partnership, we are charting a course toward a brighter future for education and empowering our students to thrive.


Enhanced Learning Spaces


The Simulation Lab is now open for business!

Mational Accueditations

Recently, Millersville University has been awarded two national accreditations for its outstanding education programs!



ILA National Recognition with Distinction:

The International Literacy Association (ILA) National Recognition with Distinction was awarded to Millersville University for its Reading/Literacy Specialist Program in April 2025. This accolade is given only to the best licensure, certificate, and endorsement programs for Reading Specialists and/or Elementary Educators. Programs with the ILA recognition meet rigorous, evidence-based standards that guide the development of reading experts.



Currently, only 5 other universities have been recognized by the ILA *with distinction*, and a mere 16 others have received general recognition.



IDA Accreditation:

Thanks to the work of Drs. Aileen Hower and Jennifer Shettel, the International Dyslexia Association (IDA) accredited the M.Ed. In Language & Literacy - Reading Specialist for its alignment with the <u>IDA's Knowledge and Practice Standards for Teachers of Reading (KPS)</u>.

This means that graduates who choose to take the KPEERI exam will be Center for Effective Reading Instruction nationally certified in Reading/Dyslexia.

There are currently only 31 other accredited institutes of higher education.

IDA accredited programs must also prove efficacy, producing educators with comprehensive supervised experiences in structured literacy. According to the IDA, the goal of such rigorous training is "preventing reading failure and remediating off-track readers with profiles characteristic of dyslexia."

Overall, the IDA values consistency, improving student outcomes, advocating for students, and shaping the best practice.








ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE ENDORSEMENT

Today, Zach is charting the next leg of his journey as a graduate student in Clinical Psychology here at Millersville University, with hopes of becoming a counselor to help others navigate life's waters. Dr. Alessandra Landini is an Italian educator, researcher, and innovator who is joining the College of Education & Human Services as a Fulbright Scholar this academic year.

Dr. Landini's professional interests include integrative education, narrative approaches to science education, research in STEM education (especially physics), vertical curriculum development, inclusive education for students with specific disabilities, multicultural education, and teacher education. In fact, when she arrived to Millersville, Dr. Landini was immediately intrigued by the simulation lab. She is eager to train in use of the lab and explore its possibilities for advancing education!

In Italy, Dr. Landini is the Headmaster of the Instituto Comprensivo A. Manzoni (Comprehensive School A. Manzoni) in Reggio Emilia, Italy. The Comprehensive school is comprised of 5 separate buildings/schools, including a childhood center, 3 primary schools, and a middle school. Altogether, the schools serve over 950 students, ages 3 through 14, of whom at least 50% are immigrants.

Dr. Landini's most recent project has focused on moving education out of the classroom and into the larger cultural context of the town in which the schools are located. What initially began as a social distancing solution during the COVID-19 pandemic has turned into an innovative pedagogy. Dr. Landini's schools are currently implementing a 3-year curriculum "of heritage and citizenship" that promotes peace among cultures and is inherently inclusive. On any given day, the students may be learning anywhere in the city, a concept known as "wide-spread schools" that promotes feelings of civic responsibility by students and improved interactions between the general public and students. The curriculum also promotes education as a process of curiosity that is not confined to the school building.

While at Millersville, Dr. Landini is excited to collaborate with Dr. Beth Powers, Dr. Tiffany Wright, and Dr. Ann Gaudino to update Millersville's approach to educating educators, especially those focusing on Literacy, Educational Leadership, and Curriculum/ Assessment.

Dr. Jennie Burke

Dr. Jennie Burke delivered the kickoff address for a national professional development series hosted by the Department of Education of the Philippines in partnership with Thames International School, Manila.

Her session, Fostering Belonging: Connecting SEL & Diversity in the Classroom, reached over 3,900 educators across the country. The session launched a nationwide effort to promote social-emotional learning and inclusion in classrooms throughout the Philippines!

Dr. Burke also had the incredible opportunity to spend time at the Library of Congress this summer as part of the *Transformative Teaching Initiative Fellowship*, through the *Teaching with Primary Sources* (TPS) *Consortium*.

Dr. Andrew Bland

Dr. Andrew Bland (Psychology) has been working tirelessly over the past decade as a core faculty member in the Clinical Psychology Master's Program. Beyond his typical duties of teaching and guiding students, Dr. Bland has been actively involved in the professional development of his field.

In the past 6 months alone, Dr. Bland has:

- Published an article, "Hope in Trust, Trust in Hope," in the Samaritan Center 2024 Community Impact Report.
- Published a book chapter, "Research on Existential—Humanistic Psychotherapy," in the edited volume, Evidence-Based Foundations of Existential—Humanistic Therapy (published by the American Psychological Association).




Dr. Jason Petula presented a Masterclass on "Climate Change Across the Curriculum" at Thames International (Manila, Philippines).

DSW Students Publish OER Book



This summer, faculty and students traveled across the U.S. to present results from the Center for Civic Responsibility and Leadership's (CCRL) research during the 2024-2025 academic year. The research was entitled "Exploring Levels of Civic Engagement Among Undergraduate Students at Millersville University: New Roles for Macro Social Workers."

Two Master of Social Work Students, Evelyn Morales (2025) and Alexis Stengel (2025), traveled to both the Macro United Conference in St. Louis, MO during May 2025 and the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Conference in Chicago, IL during June 2025 to present their research findings.

The research was designed and implemented by Dr. Lara Granruth (SOWK) and CCRL undergraduate fellows Hailey Peirce (Biology), Sidney Bernhardt (History Education), and Gabriella "Ella" Vilardo (Special Education). Alexis and Evelyn analyzed the data, created their poster, and raised funds for the trip with the support of Dr. Granruth.



The Center for Civic Responsibility and Leadership at Millersville University

exists to develop students' civic development. It provides student-centered projects and activities, including fellowships, to aid students in honing skills essential for being active, engaged citizens.

Overall, the research contained two significant findings:

- 1. Undergraduate students at Millersville University who identify as belonging to "lower" income families had higher mean scores on the total scale for civic engagement attitude and behaviors compared to students who identified coming from "higher" income families.
- 2. Students who had a "service learning experience" had higher civic engagement scores compered to students who did not complete a service learning experience

2025 Mational Teacher of the Year

Ashlie Crosson, an Alum of Millersville University, was named the 2025 National Teacher of the Year!

Ashlie Crosson was named the 2025 National Teacher of the Year on May 1st by the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO). Although she received her initial teaching certification from Penn State University, Ashlie turned to Millersville University for earning her Gifted Education Endorsement.

Crosson is being honored for all the work she has done to inspire students, especially first-generation students Crosson's and future writers. And list of accomplishments is extensive. Not only was she a firstgeneration college student who grew up in the school district where she now teaches, but she mentors students as her teachers did for her. In her 14 years of teaching, Crosson revitalized a journalism program that enables students to creatively express themselves, and began advising two student publications. In 2018, Crosson was a Fulbright Teacher for Global Classrooms Fellow. As a Fulbright Fellow, Crosson refocused her courses to foster global citizenship.
