Curriculum Record Form for an Academic Minor in Social Justice

Minor: Social Justice
 Department: Social Work

Total credit hours required: 18.0 minimum

The Social Justice minor is designed to provide non-social work majors the opportunity to develop knowledge and understanding about social justice within a person-in-environment context. Social justice is core to all social work practice and the primary goals for the minor in Social Justice are to enhance sensitivity to vulnerable and at-risk populations, provide opportunity for critical review of social policies and the allocation of societal resources, and stimulate interest in advocacy and planned social change. This minor is intended to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to advocate from a social, economic, and environmental justice framework.

Regulations Governing Minor Course Work:

1. There shall be a minimum of 18.0 credit hours with a minimum Millersville QPA of 2.0.
2. Only one course which counts toward the major may be counted toward the minor.
3. Courses that count toward a minor are also eligible to be used to satisfy the current University-wide General Education requirements subject to normal distribution requirements.
4. At least two courses should be at the upper-division level (300-400). Exceptions may be requested upon evidence of program depth.
5. No course needed for the minor may be taken Pass-Fail.
6. One-half or more of the work required for the minor must be completed at Millersville University.
7. No student may minor in his or her major.
