Cover Page and Abstract	
The title information should be in the middle of the cover page, while the abstract should begin at the top of its page. This visualization is compacted to appear in a shortened form.

Abstract	
<p>The abstract page serves as a short overview to your paper. It will allow readers to gauge if they want to read further or not. Think of a scholarly journal with academic vocabulary: you don't want to read pages and pages of a paper if it turns out to not be relevant to you! Also, name a few (3-5) keywords that are integral to your paper.</p> <p><i>Keywords:</i> APA, formatting, headings, citations</p>

Level 3	<p><i>Flush left, Bold and Italic, Upper and Lowercase Heading</i></p> <p>The paragraph begins on a new line and is indented.</p>
Level 4	<p>Indented, bold, Upper and Lowercase Heading Ending With a Period. The paragraph begins in the same line as the heading.</p>
Level 5	<p><i>Indented, Bold and Italics, Upper and Lowercase Ending With a Period.</i> The paragraph begins in the same line as the heading.</p>

- Note that except for the first word, the first word after a semicolon, and proper nouns, titles are lower-cased in APA.
- When citing multiple different sources by the same author, order them by year, i.e. (Smith, 2003) would come before (Smith, 2020) in the reference list.
- If there are multiple works by the same author written in the same year, label them with letters, i.e. (Smith, 2020a) and (Smith, 2020b), in both your reference list and in-text citation.
- If you can't find an author name, use a group author, i.e. (Google, 2020).
- If you cannot find a date, use n.d. to mean "no date". For example: (Smith n.d.)
