- Students placed in higher-level language courses in their first semester will replace 101 and/or 102 with 200- or 300-level electives.
- Many courses are only offered in Fall or Spring, not in both. Students should talk to their advisors to build their individual four-year pathways.
- Courses in French, German, and Spanish are not offered during the winter and summer session except for graduate courses in German and Spanish which advanced students may be permitted to take.
- Study Abroad in the junior year is highly recommended. Students should discuss their plans with advisors as early as possible. Up to half of the courses in the major as well as general education courses in G1 and G3 may be taken abroad.
- Students are encouraged to use their open electives in combination with General Education courses to expand their required minor into a second major or to pick up a second minor in another field.
