- a. Dr. James Delle, Associate Provost
  - i. Dr. Delle noted that winter session registration is open and reminded faculty that this is a good opportunity for students to catch up or get ahead with credit hours which improves graduation rates.
  - ii. Dr. Delle provided an update from the fall census. Enrollments are generally down across the system. MU is down approximately 4%.

- iii. A question regarding winter session credit hour limits and student success was discussed. Dr. Delle will investigate some winter session data.
- iv. A question about how financial aid for winter and summer courses was raised. It was noted that aid is generally rolled into the previous semester and must be used to takes courses in the program of study. Referring students to the financial aid office is typically the best course of action.

  - 1. Not officially, however, MU recently received approval for a significant number of new programs and there is interest to seeing how these develop.
