ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT PROFILE: KEREAH KELLER

Kereah (kuh-ray-uh) Keller is the new Honors College Administrative Assistant. Kereah grew up in Pottstown, PA. She has a Bachelor's degree in English as a Second Language and a Master's degree in English & Creative Writing. Q: What do you like to do in your free time? Any hobbies or favorites?

A: "I love video games, especially RPGs. Fire Emblem: Three Houses is a big one for me right now. I play a lot with my husband as well. We do everything from Legend of Zelda to Phasmophobia to Outlast. I'm also really into anime. I like reading manga and watching anime—again, a lot of times with my husband, since we share similar interests. I'm also a writer. I've been writing since I was about five years old. I have several books that are self-published and a couple that I am looking to get signed by an agent."

Q: What made you interested in this job?

A: "I've had a lot of jobs in administration, especially in education. I worked for Derry Township School District for four years, and I really enjoyed the classroom setting. I spent the last year doing marketing

online for IU13, so I was able to work a lot from home. The reason that I reached out to Millersville was because my former position would not allow me to go full time, and my husband is a stay-at-home dad for our two kids, so something that paid more and had better hours is what I was looking for—also something that I was familiar with, so that I could kind of slip into the position and not have too many issues with it."

Q: You've mentioned your husband and kids. Can you say a little bit about them?

A: "I have been married for almost 10 years to my husband; we got married in August 2013. His name is Josh. I have two kids. My son is the oldest. His name is Fletcher. He's seven and a half. My daughter is the youngest. Her name is Raven and she's five."



Q: What is your favorite thing about Millersville so far?

A: "I love being able to talk with the students. A lot of people say that I look like I'm 18, so everyone assumes I'm a student, but I like having those connections, like knowing what's going on around campus or being able to share some of my experiences and not feel like I'm talking to fifth graders. Fifth graders are great, don't get me wrong, but at the same time, you can't relate to them the same way that you can with college students."

Q: What is something that you think is important for Honors College students to know about you to have a good rapport?

A: "I want to prove myself to be somebody that is trustworthy. Not just with events and planning, but also if they have a question or something personal, that they don't have questions about who to go to for advice. I like using the fact that I look young to my strength. Knowing that I really wanted someone who would mentor me when I was in college, building around that, and being somebody for someone else, so that I could help them that way."

Q: Describe one way you have helped a student during a research appointment.

A: "Thinking about how to approach a research interest; contextualizing their research effort to improve resource selection and terminology."

Q: What's your favorite book?

A: "Generally history, a good mystery, and classic literature every now and again. I avoid cookbooks as I have learned good cooks frequently don't follow them anyway."

Q: Do you have any interesting hobbies? What are they?

A: "I am a competitive rifleman, and I compete regularly in the area and participate in large regional and national competitions as well."

Q: Why did you become a librarian?

A: "I enjoyed the research process as an undergraduate student and found myself helping other students work through the research process. I was considering graduate school for business or law and thought, before I do that, perhaps I should earn a Master of Library Science. It's made doing research ever since much more efficient."

Q: Current research interests?

A: "Frameworks for resource sharing by library consortia. Open source software."

Q: Where would you like to travel?

A: "Nearly anyplace I haven't already been! Next up is Scandinavia, London, then New Zealand or Japan."

Q: If you have a pet or pets, share something about them?

A: "Two dogs; a Bichon Frise (all white) and a Yorkchon (nearly all black). They're quite the handful. They work in tandem and frequently ask for things on behalf of the other."

RESEARCH TOOLKIT: TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL SEARCH OF RESEARCH

It can be challenging to successfully locate appropriate research. Here are a few tips to help you navigate some common research quandaries.

Not finding relevant search results?

- Consider synonyms (alternate words with similar meaning)
- Technical terms (the terms used by the field or discipline of which you are focused)
- Be more specific. Instead of "student", try college student, or a specific grade level
- Think about the "where" or "how" your topic happens

Not locating the type of content needed (article, book chapter, review, dissertation, etc)?

• Usually along the left side, there are options to refine your search results by Source Type.

Need more research?

- If you find a relevant article, click on the title (within the result list) and review the keywords and subjects listed. Consider using these terms in your search
- Try a different database


