



IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE

Permitted Student Enrollment – Fall and Spring Semesters



At least 12 credits per semester



Graduate Level

6 Credits per semester



Online Course

3 credits per semester

Permitted International Student Employment

On-Campus Employment

- Benefit of F-1 or J1 visa Not special/ additional authorization needed
- 20 hours/week during academic session
- Over 20 hours/week during school breaks



Off-Campus Employment


Curriculum Practical Training (CPT)

- Internship/Practicum Training
- Academic Training (J1 Visa)
- Must be related to academic major
- Recommended by academic department
- Approved by IPS

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

- Pre Completion OPT
- Post Completion OPT
- STEM OPT Extension (24 months)
- Must be related to academic major
- Recommended by IPS
- Adjudicated by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)

Reduced Course Load (RCL) Provisions

Reasons	Guidelines
 Academic Difficulties, including: Improper course level placement Initial difficulty with reading requirements Initial difficulty with the English language Unfamiliarity with U.S. teaching methods 	 Can only be used for the initial academic term Student must maintain a minimum six-credit course load, or half the clock hours required for a full course of study Student must begin a full course of study at the next offered term RCL start and end dates must correspond to the school session start and end dates
Illness or Medical Condition	 Cannot exceed 12-month aggregate per program level May excuse a student from all classes Student must provide medical documentation from a licensed: Medical Doctor Doctor of Osteopathy Clinical Psychologist Start date should be the date DSO approved the RCL
To Complete Course of Study In Current Term	 Used in a student's final term if he/she can complete the program with fewer classes Student must be enrolled in at least one required class



Taking less than a full course load – Fall and Spring

Reasons a student could lose immigration status

Online Courses – Beyond the permitted number

Unauthorized employment

Not following any other immigration regulations



Why talk about Immigration Compliance

Lose the ability to issue immigration documents for students and scholars

Institution could lose the certification to enroll and retain international students

Not have the ability to welcome visiting scholars


- Explore the Fulbright Opportunities
