

## MINOR IN MUSIC

The music unit offers a minor in music to students with a major outside of the department and has for many years. The music minor is designed for non-music major students interested in further development of performance skills on an instrument or voice. Courses, in addition to private lessons, are designed to reinforce the overall musical background of the student.

The minor in music is not intended as professional preparation for any leadership role in music, particularly in the field of music education. The minor in music is intended solely for personal enrichment.

Admission to the program is by audition for students who elect major performance and ensemble participation. Students who do not elect major performance and only wish to concentrate on liberal arts minor in music may apply to the program through the music unit chair and secretary.

[Several university regulations](#) govern minor course work, including:

1. There shall be a minimum of 18.0 credit hours with a minimum Millersville GPA of 2.0.
2. Courses that count toward a minor are also eligible to be used to satisfy the current University wide General Education requirements.
3. No courses needed for the minor may be taken pass-fail.
4. One-half of the course work required for the minor must be completed at Millersville University.
5. A grade of "C" or higher is required for successful completion of all minor classes.

### **Required:**

- MUSI 100 Music in Culture (3 Credits)
- MUSI 103 Language of Music I **OR**
- MUSI 104 Language of Music II (3 Credits)

### **Electives: Total: 12 Credits**

Students choose 6 Credits of any 100 or 200 level MUSI class.

Optional – audition, 3.0 Credits of major performance concurrent with 3 semesters of ensembles

Students choose 6 Credits of any 300 or 400 level MUSI class.
