	<p><i>Students as Performers: Students as Stewards of their Cultural Heritage</i></p> <p><u>Singing Competency</u></p> <p>Sight Reading: Student sight-read a folk song with 3 or less errors</p> <p><u>Piano Performance Competency</u></p> <p>Patriotic Songs: Student sang and played the patriotic songs with 3 or less errors. MM=65bpm</p> <p>Sight Reading: Student sight read a folk song and played a simple tonic/dominant/subdominant accompaniment at the keyboard with 3 or less errors.</p>	
	<p><i>Students as Critical Thinkers: Students as Creative Human Beings</i></p> <p>Student's writing was thoughtful, creative, and well organized with evidence of pedagogical knowledge.</p> <p>Philosophy: Student stated their philosophy of music education including the role of the multiple dimensions of musicianship and its effects on teaching and student learning.</p> <p>Student wrote their points and provided a brief explanation of the meaning of each aspect of within their philosophy.</p> <p>Student's philosophy was between 200-300 words.</p>	

	<p>Wordle: Student used text from their philosophy and created a WORDLE using music vocabulary directly from their philosophy.</p> <p>Comparison Paragraph: Student wrote a paragraph, between 100-150 words, comparing a measurable and non-measurable objective. This comparison included detail on how assessment based on a measurable objective directly affects ongoing instruction in the classroom or rehearsal.</p> <p>Video: The video is 3 minutes in length and is a focused example of instruction of Core Activities (Kinesthetic, Aural, Visual, Labeling and/or Presentation).</p>
