WSON Chair Update

Greetings from the Wehrheim School of Nursing (WSN)! In August, I began my 25th year at Millersville University! Through these years, I have served in part-time and full-time adjunct roles, as well as my current tenured position. One thing has been consistent over the years – the commitment of the Nursing faculty to the success of our students and our programs. Over the past year, we have continued to grow our enrollments at all levels, with our MSN programs seeing incredible growth! For the 11th newsletter in a row, I am pleased to report more program additions. In the spring, the PA State Board of Nursing approved the addition of a fully online Family/Individual Across the Lifespan Nurse Practitioner option and we admitted our first cohort of the program this fall. As you will read later in the newsletter, this summer we announced a new level of collaboration with HACC Nursing, allowing HACC RN students the opportunity to accelerate their BSN path. Continuous development of programs and curricula is no easy task and I applaud our dedicated nursing faculty for their willingness to engage in the hard work and enthusiasm required. The Wehrheim faculty are truly exceptional in their willingness to support the ever-changing needs of our students and community! In the past five years, our nursing graduate programs have grown by more than 60%. With the addition of our new HACC collaboration, our RN to BSN program has grown 40% since last fall! Especially notable is the monumental growth in the School Nurse Certificate and MSN programs – over the past year, the school nurse certification program grew by an amazing 182% more than doubling in size!



And it's not all about program growth, we also have great things happening with our faculty! This fall, we are thrilled to congratulate Dr. Susan Moyer on receiving tenure and being promoted to Associate Professor. Further, we welcome Dr. Bryan Weinberg-Wonsidler as our newest full-time faculty member. You'll read more about Dr. W-W later in the newsletter. As I write this newsletter, I'm completing my first on-site visit as a NLN Commission on Nursing Education Accreditation program reviewer.

And if all of that isn't enough – for the 2024 – 2025 academic year, the Wehrheim School of Nursing will distribute more than \$225,000 in scholarships funds to our students. We have been able to provide scholarships to all levels of students, including 26 of our newest MU/HACC Concurrent Education students receiving funds!

New BSN Pathway: Through a Concurrent Agreement With HACC

In June 2024, we formally announced our newest collaborative program with our strongest local educational partner – Harrisburg Area Community College. In this innovative program, students who have been admitted to the HACC RN program can be simultaneously admitted to our RN to BSN program. This allows students to take courses at Millersville and HACC at the same time, accelerating the student's path to their BSN!

Another key benefit of this program is helping students to maintain their financial aid eligibility – by adding MU courses to their HACC plan, students are able to maintain a full- or part-time status. After our summer announcement, we have more than 80 students enrolled in the Concurrent Education Program (CEP) this fall, with more than 50 already admitted for the spring term. We have been shocked and delighted at the student enthusiasm for the program, and we are thrilled to be able to so clearly meet the needs of our community!

“We are delighted to continue our long-standing partnership with HACC,” said Dr. Daniel A. Wubah, president of Millersville University. “This is a great example of our EPPiC value regarding Public Mission. We are responding to the work force needs of our communities while offering our students quality programs.”

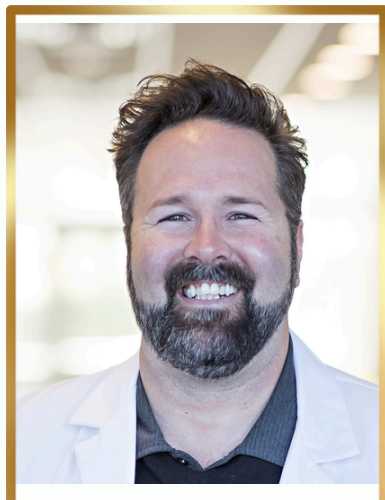

He is an alumnus of Millersville University, completing a Doctor of Nursing Practice in 2021, his Evidenced Based Project titled Improving LGBT+ Healthcare Education and Training for Healthcare Professionals: An Evidenced Based Practice Project. Dr. Jenny Monn has Formally Announced her Retirement



Dr. Jenny Monn has formally announced her retirement following the Spring 2025 semester. Dr. Monn has served as a member of the Nursing faculty, beginning as an adjunct clinical family nurse practitioner supervisor in 2008, to tenure track faculty beginning in 2013, where she attained her tenure as an associate professor and continues to serve the Wehrheim School of Nursing full-time.

Like many of our students, Dr. Monn journeyed into nursing through an alternative pathway, earning a BS in Individual and Family Studies from Penn State in 1987 and then a Diploma in Nursing at St. Joseph's Hospital in Lancaster in 1995. She is a proud Millersville Alumni, where she completed her BSN in 2003, and her MSN and certification as a Family Nurse Practitioner in 2007. She completed her Doctor of Nursing Practice from York College of Pennsylvania in 2015. Throughout her academic career, she attained and maintained board certification with the American Nurses Credentialing Center and even became board-certified through the same agency in College Health Nursing.

At present, Dr. Monn continues to serve in the community as an FNP at Penn Medicine-Lancaster General and enjoys keeping her skills in the urgent care setting. She continues teaching regular courses, including undergraduate courses in Nursing 316: Women's Health and Healthcare, Nursing 340 Environmental Factors, and most of the graduate FNP curriculum. She serves as a regular DNP project advisor. She served as the graduate program coordinator for the FNP program from 2014-2019 and regularly oversaw 125+ students as their primary academic advisor over the years.

A little-known fact about Dr. Monn is she served as the Millersville University Health Center FNP from 2007-2013, where she provided comprehensive primary care to all the college students at MU. Prior to that she also worked as the MU Campus RN from 2000-2007, where she developed lots of new projects and initiatives including coordination of Breast-A-Ville for many years. Prior to College Nursing, she served as a labor and delivery nurse at St. Joseph's Hospital, Lancaster. Over the years, Dr. Monn has worked tirelessly to obtain grants and participate in local and national NP organizations. She also has many publications and presentations under her belt.

During her tenure here at Millersville, she has served a key role in many departmental, and University committees. She has been awarded numerous awards including, the Xi Chi Excellence in Nursing Research Award – Millersville University (2003), the Joan Godfrey Award, Department of Nursing - Millersville University (2003, 2007), Induction into the Sigma Theta Tau National Nursing Honor Society (2003), the Who's Who Among College Graduates (2003), the Mildred E. Souder Service Award, St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing (1995), and the Association of Operating Room Nurses Perioperative Nursing Award (1995).

Beyond her outstanding accomplishments and dedication to the department, Dr. Monn is considered a genuine friend, colleague, and mentor among all the Wehrheim School of Nursing friends, students, and faculty.

Dr. Monn always has the most creative and unique sayings that kept any faculty meeting lively. For example, "That's the way the pickle squirts," "Oh Mylanta," and "Separating fly poop from pepper" are a few of our collective favorites. Dr. Monn will always have a place at the Wehrheim School of Nursing faculty conference table, and most importantly, her imprint on our lives. We will sincerely miss her as part of the faculty team.

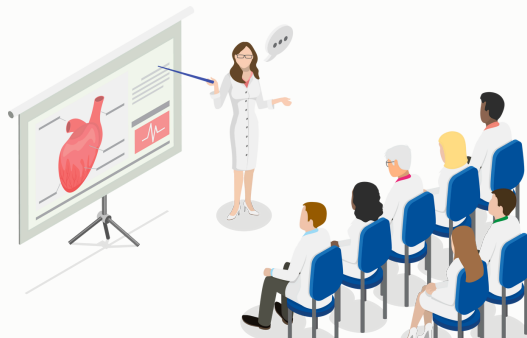

The Wehrheim School of Nursing is hosting our annual Scholarship Symposium to showcase hard work of our graduate students and their capstone projects. Every year, our exceptional students demonstrate their talent and skills at this event. Join us in person or remotely via zoom.



Faculty Accomplishments:

Dr. Lambert was invited to be a member of an advisory committee for a project the Center for School Health Innovation and Quality is working on to develop a school nurse educator training for Pennsylvania. This program is being funded by a grant from the Moses Taylor Foundation and will be designed to educate school leaders regarding the role of the school nurse in order to help them better understand the role of the school nurse and learn how to better collaborate with school nurses. This three year project also includes partnering with universities to develop a module that can be used for students studying to be teachers and principals.



In June 2024, Dr. Cayleigh Minter presented a quality improvement project at the International WOCNext, the Wound, Ostomy, Continence Society's annual conference. Dr. Minter presented on behalf of her interprofessional team at UPMC in Cleveland, Ohio.

This event aligns with the National Wear Red initiative of the American Heart Association, which seeks to raise awareness of women and heart disease. 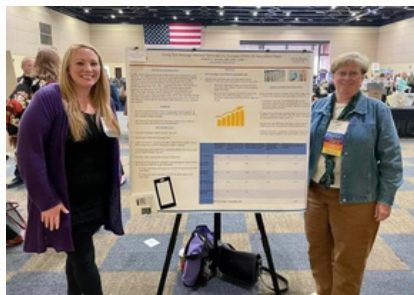
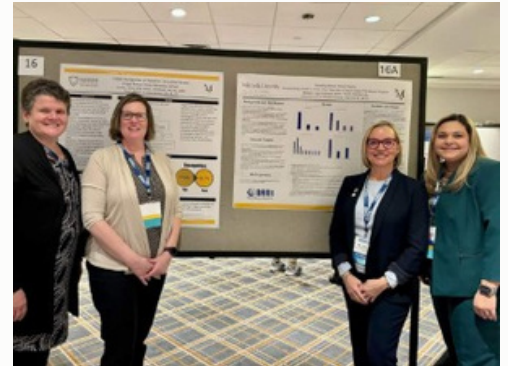
