Regulations Governing Certificate Course Work:

1. There shall be a minimum of 15.0 credit hours with a minimum Millersville QPA of 2.0.
2. Only one course which counts toward your major may be counted toward your certificate.
3. Courses that count toward a certificate are also eligible to be used to satisfy the current University-wide General Education requirements subject to normal distribution requirements.
4. At least two courses should be at the upper-division level (300-400). Exceptions may be requested upon evidence of program depth.
5. No course needed for the certificate may be taken Pass-Fail.
6. One-half or more of the work required for the certificate must be completed at Millersville University.
