

PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

JANUARY 2026

As winter settles in across our region, the recent snowfall has transformed our campus into a truly remarkable winter landscape. While winter weather can sometimes complicate travel and daily routines, it also provides a moment to appreciate the natural beauty that surrounds us. I have enjoyed viewing these scenic grounds from the comfort of Tanger House, and I hope many of you have found time to enjoy this seasonal backdrop as well. I am deeply grateful to our facilities and grounds teams for their unwavering commitment to snow removal and for keeping our walkways treated and accessible for all members of our community.



I am also pleased to share encouraging preliminary enrollment data for the first day of the Spring 2026 semester. Our total student headcount increased from 6,532 last year to 6,685 this year, representing a 2.3 percent growth. Graduate enrollment continues its strong upward trajectory, and we are pleased to see modest gains in undergraduate enrollment. Additionally, 61.1 percent of our full-time undergraduates are enrolled in 15 or more credits, up from 58.3 percent last year which is a positive indicator for student success and momentum into the semester ahead.

Recent tragic events in Minnesota and across the nation, including the fatal shootings of American citizens by federal law enforcement that have generated widespread concern and reflection in communities nationwide, remind us of the importance of reaffirming our values and ensuring the safety and security of our campus. Millersville University remains steadfast in its commitment to being a community where every individual feels respected, valued, and secure. Our top priority is to support uninterrupted academic progress and campus operations while providing continuous access to essential student resources and support services, all within the framework of applicable laws and regulations. As a reminder and in follow-up to earlier communications, if you encounter external law enforcement officers on campus, please remain composed and professional, and immediately direct them to the Millersville University Police Department.
