Important Tasks for Clinical Students

- **Outline your entire program of study with your advisor.** Decide early on the 42 or 60 credit option.
- **Read the LPC law.** Download a copy and keep it.
- **The graduate catalogue is the official record of all graduate** program policies, procedures and specific course descriptions that were in effect during the time of your matriculation. If licensing boards have questions about whether you met the educational requirements, a course description from the graduate catalogue is vital, along with the syllabus from that course when you took it.
- **Save ALL courses syllabi.** Licensing boards or licensing exam sponsors may request these to determine if educational requirements were met by a particular course.
- **Get an OFFICIAL transcript after graduation.** Employers and licensing boards require official transcripts. Check for accuracy and date of M.S. degree conferral.
- **Keep a file of all graduate work/info.** Documenting education, training, experience is essential for licensure and employment. Keep this information indefinitely.

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
