Emergency Supply Kit – Dorm/Apartment

Kept in a small, portable container

3 Gallons of Water	One gallon per person per day, for drinking and sanitation
3 Day Supply of Food	Non-perishable food
Can Opener	If kit contains canned food
Battery-Powered Radio w/Extra Batteries	For news and weather updates
Filter Mask or Cotton T-shirt	To help filter the air
First Aid Kit	Should include: bandages, anti-septic cream, burn spray, non-aspirin pain reliever, and gloves
Whistle	To signal for help
Moist Towelettes	For sanitation
Daily Prescription Medications	Emergency supply
Important Medical Documentation	Kept in sealed bag

Emergency Supply Kit – Car

3 Gallons of Water	One gallon per person per day, for drinking and sanitation
3 Day Supply of Food	Non-perishable food (i.e. Canned)
Can Opener	If kit contains canned food
Battery Powered Radio w/Extra Batteries	For news and weather updates
Filter Mask or Cotton T-shirt	To help filter the air
First Aid Kit	Should include: bandages, anti-septic cream, burn spray, non-aspirin pain reliever, and gloves
Extra Battery Pack for Cell Phone	In case your phone dies and you need to call for help
Moist Towelettes	For sanitation
Daily Prescription Medications	Emergency Supply of each medication
Cat Litter, Salt, Saw Dust, etc.	For traction if your car is stuck in mud or snow
\$20 in small bills and change	For miscellaneous use
Disposable flash camera	Lets you record the condition of your vehicle when in an accident
Pen and pad of paper	For jotting down information after an accident
Warning light, hazard triangle, or flares	In order to make motorists aware of your car on the side of the road
Jack and lug wrench	In case you must change a tire
Small Foldable Shovel	In case you are stuck in snow
