
Step 1: enter "millersville.edu/spra/IRB/" in your web browser.


Step 2: at the Institutional Review Board webpage, scroll to the bottom

Step 3: click on the CITI logo to go to the CITI homepage






Do nothing else on this page except click on "LOG IN THROUGH MY OGRANIZATION".




Begin to type "Millersville University of Pennsylvania" in the text box after "To find your organization ..." CITI will recognize the name and offer the full name in a drop down.

Click on "Millersville University of Pennsylvania" in the drop down.




Click on the blue "Continue to SSO Login / Instructions" button.
