**Objectives:** The aim of this course is to provide non-biologists with a basic understanding of the biology of human sexuality including the anatomy and physiology of sex and sexual reproduction in humans. This course will also explore the interface between the biological and social aspects of sex and sexuality. As part of our examination of human sexuality topics such as gender, homosexuality, contraception, pornography, forcible sexual acts, and sexually transmitted diseases will be covered. Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1) Describe the anatomy and physiology of the male and female reproductive systems
- 2) Describe the events of conception, pregnancy and childbirth
- 3) Recognize and understand how to use all forms of contraception
- 4) Recognize all forms and expressions of gender and sexuality
- 5) Describe human sexual behaviors and understand the relationship between these behaviors and social context

**Note:** This course contains content and language that is of an explicit sexual nature. Visual materials depicting nudity, sexual situations, explicit language, and other mature content is part of this course. It is expected that all material will be approached in a strictly academic manner and with appropriate respectfulness.

**Pronouns and Preferred Names:** Please let me know if you have a preferred name or preferred pronouns. I will try to use gender-neutral pronouns; however, societal gender constructs are hard to overcome. Forgive me if I use the wrong pronoun, and don't hesitate to politely correct me.

# Writing a Research Paper Worksheet: 15 points

In order to ensure that you understand the expectations for writing a research paper you must access and review all of the material in the Research Paper module. Once you have reviewed this information you will be able to access and complete the 'Writing a Research Paper Worksheet' due Friday February 12<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.

#### Presentation: 50 points

You will prepare a 5 - 7 minute presentation on your research topic. Presentations are due Friday March 5<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm

# Research Paper: 150 points

You will select a topic from the "Research Paper Topics" and write a 6-page research paper on that topic. You must utilize and cite at least 3 peer-reviewed sources for your paper. In addition to the 6 pages of your research paper you will include a literature cited page which identifies at least 3 peer reviewed sources used in your research. Your research will be the foundation for your presentation. Papers are due Friday March 19<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.

#### Presentation Critiques: 30 points

You will each watch 3 presentations and complete a written critique for each presentation. You may not critique your own presentation. Critiques are due Friday March. 26<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.

## **Book Review Worksheet: 10 pts.**

In order to ensure that you are familiar with the expectations for writing a book report you will review all the content in the Book Review module and complete the 'Book Review Worksheet' due Friday April 9<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.

### Book Review: 50 points

You will read a book on a topic relevant to human sexuality. After reading the book you will prepare a 4 page review of this book (~1000 words). Your book review is due Friday April 16<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.

## **Revision of Papers:** points will vary

You have the option of revising either your research paper or your book review to improve your grade. Revisions must show significant improvement from the original. If you choose to revise one of your papers you can regain up to 30% of the points missed on your first version.

**Late Assignments:** Late assignments will be accepted, but subject to a penalty of 10% of total points for each calendar day an assignment is late after the due date.
